¹¹ Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as *We are*.

¹² While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled.

¹³ But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves.

Introduction

In 1644, representatives of 7 churches gathered to summarize their common confession of faith, and to distinguish themselves from the Anabaptists and the Arminians. It was a time of turmoil, since the Reformation doctrines had swept across England. This was one of the first of several non-Anglican groups in that century to put pen to paper and confess their faith.

Around that same time another group was called together in 1643 by Long Parliament

The place was Westminster Abbey, that famous London church. The room inside the Abbey was called the Jerusalem Room. There was a gathering of the best theological minds and the greatest biblical scholars in England.

The Puritans were the dominating force there, the well-known lovers of Scripture, lovers of God, lovers of Christ, lovers of truth. And these Puritans

gathered together, about a hundred of them, with lords and commoners together, and they embarked upon a five-year endeavor: five years of intense study of Scripture, five years of intense dialogue, five years of intense scholastic effort, five years of discussion, five years to produce a statement of doctrine. Five years later, in the year 1649, they completed their task. And what they produced, along with a number of important works, was known as the “Westminster Confession of Faith.”

Well-known Puritans like Thomas Goodwin, James Usher, Jay Lightfoot, Samuel Rutherford, Jeremiah Burroughs, and the chairman of this group, a man named Twisse labored for these five years to produce what has become the most important Christian creed called the Westminster Confession of Faith.

And then in 1658, the Congregationalists would follow suit with the “Savoy Declaration”. Among the theological heavy weights in this production was John Owen.

That original group of 7 churches that worked in 1644 on the 1st London Baptist Confession were the Particular Baptists. Amid threats of persecution, and to show their solidarity and theological agreement in many ways with the Presbyterians and Congregationalists that had since written their own

confessions, a larger crop of Baptists would draft the 1677 Baptist Confession with great reliance on the WCF and Savoy, however, this confession would be put forth by a General Assembly of Particular Baptists ultimately in 1689, giving it the name that it is known by today: “The 1689 London Baptist Confession of Faith”, often called the *Second London Baptist Confession of Faith*.

The Solidarity of these confessions, gave great weight and authority to the doctrines they believe and proclaimed.

On the Topic of Eternal Security or Better, The Perseverance of the Saints
2nd London Baptist Confession of Faith States,

Chapter 17: Of The Perseverance of the Saints

1. Those whom God hath accepted in the beloved, effectually called and sanctified by his Spirit, and given the precious faith of his elect unto, can neither totally nor finally fall from the state of grace, but shall certainly persevere therein to the end, and be eternally saved, seeing the gifts and callings of God are without repentance, whence he still begets and nourisheth in them faith, repentance, love, joy,

hope, and all the graces of the Spirit unto immortality; and though many storms and floods arise and beat against them, yet they shall never be able to take them off that foundation and rock which by faith they are fastened upon; notwithstanding, through unbelief and the temptations of Satan, the sensible sight of the light and love of God may for a time be clouded and obscured from them, yet he is still the same, and they shall be sure to be kept by the power of God unto salvation, where they shall enjoy their purchased possession, they being engraven upon the palm of his hands, and their names having been written in the book of life from all eternity. (John 10:28, 29; Philippians 1:6; 2 Timothy 2:19; 1 John 2:19; Psalms 89:31, 32; 1 Corinthians 11:32; Malachi 3:6)

2._____ This perseverance of the saints depends not upon their own free will, but upon the immutability of the decree of election, flowing from the free and unchangeable love of God the Father, upon the efficacy of the merit and intercession of Jesus Christ and union with him, the oath of God, the abiding of his Spirit, and the

seed of God within them, and the nature of the covenant of grace; from all which ariseth also the certainty and infallibility thereof.

(Romans 8:30 Romans 9:11, 16; Romans 5:9, 10; John 14:19; Hebrews 6:17, 18; 1 John 3:9; Jeremiah 32:40)

3._____ And though they may, through the temptation of Satan and of the world, the prevalency of corruption remaining in them, and the neglect of means of their preservation, fall into grievous sins, and for a time continue therein, whereby they incur God's displeasure and grieve his Holy Spirit, come to have their graces and comforts impaired, have their hearts hardened, and their consciences wounded, hurt and scandalize others, and bring temporal judgments upon themselves, yet shall they renew their repentance and be preserved through faith in Christ Jesus to the end.

(Matthew 26:70, 72, 74; Isaiah 64:5, 9; Ephesians 4:30; Psalms 51:10, 12; Psalms 32:3, 4; 2 Samuel 12:14; Luke 22:32, 61, 62)

I. They, whom God has accepted in His Beloved, effectually called, and sanctified by His Spirit, can neither totally nor finally fall away from the state of grace, but shall certainly persevere therein to the end, and be eternally saved.³³³

II. This perseverance of the saints depends not upon their own free will, but upon the immutability of the decree of election, flowing from the free and unchangeable love of God the Father;³³⁴ upon the efficacy of the merit and intercession of Jesus Christ,³³⁵ the abiding of the Spirit, and of the seed of God within them,³³⁶ and the nature of the covenant of grace:³³⁷ from all which arises also the certainty and infallibility thereof.³³⁸

III. Nevertheless, they may, through the temptations of Satan and of the world, the prevalency of corruption remaining in them, and the neglect of the means of their preservation, fall into grievous sins;³³⁹ and, for a time, continue therein:³⁴⁰ whereby they incur God's displeasure,³⁴¹ and grieve His Holy Spirit,³⁴² come to be deprived of some measure of their graces and comforts,³⁴³ have their hearts hardened,³⁴⁴ and their consciences wounded;³⁴⁵ hurt and scandalize others,³⁴⁶ and bring temporal judgments upon themselves.³⁴⁷

But there are some who do not affirm this truth,
 who say that we are not secure,
 That we can finally and fully fall away from the
 faith and stop believing and be lost again, after
 having been genuinely saved from our sin,
 Justified by faith, fully propitiated by the Death of
 Christ, forgiven of all our sin, yet somehow,
 through the freewill of man undo the counsels of
 God from all eternity.

But what if it is true that we are not secure, that
 we can walk away, stop believing and finally be
 damned after having been genuinely saved.

4 points I would say regarding this.

If we are not preserved, then

1. It makes the purpose of God a mere wish

Romans 8:28–30 (NKJV)

2. It makes the plan of God a mortal wreck

3. It makes the Promise of God a Malicious Myth

The purpose for Security, of being kept by the Father, is given in a series of hina clauses. (purpose clauses in the Greek NT)

Because we are being left in a very insecure place, that threatens our faith on a regular basis, the prayer of Christ on our behalf is essential for the preservation of His own and the Perseverance of the saints.

The Purpose of our Security in God

1. That the Name of God will be Glorified

11 Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. **Holy Father, keep through Your name** *those whom You have given Me*, that they may be one as We are.

12 While I was with them in the world, **I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept;** and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled.

John 17:6 (NKJV)

6 “I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were

Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept
Your word.

Earlier we have pointed out that the one who keeps us is The Father which is consistent with His Name. A Holy, Just and Faithful Father.

through Your name

I kept them in Your name.

They are kept in regards to your name, who God is.
His Holiness, Justice, Righteousness, Faithfulness.
Goodness, Graciousness, Compassion. Mercy

The basic petition could be understood in two ways. Literally translated, it reads ‘keep them in your name’ (*tērēson autous en tō onomati sou*). If the phrase *en tō onomati sou* (‘in your name’) is taken to have instrumental force (*i.e.* ‘by your name’), modifying *tērēson* (‘keep’), the petition means ‘protect them by your name’ or, more periphrastically as in niv, *protect them by the power of your name* (so, *e.g.*, Schlatter, p. 321; Bultmann, p. 503; Bruce, p. 332). In favour of this reading is the instrumental power of God’s name in some Old Testament passages: ‘Save me, O God,

by your name; vindicate me by your might' (Ps. 54:1). The parallelism shows that God's name may stand not only for the manifestation of God's character, but also for his might (*cf.* also Ps. 20:1; Pr. 18:10). Alternatively, the phrase *en tō onomati sou* ('in your name') may be taken to have locative force ('in your name'), modifying *autous* ('them'). The passage must then be rendered 'keep them in your name', *i.e.* 'keep them in loyalty to you' or 'keep them in full adherence to your character' (so, *e.g.*, Lagrange, p. 445; Lindars, p. 524; Schnackenburg, 3. 180).

Anytime the name of God is invoked, the ultimate reason is for His Glory. All is done in and by His name for His name.

This security is no less than for the Glory of God.

2. That the Scripture would be fulfilled

12 While I was with them in the world, *I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost* except the son of perdition, **that the Scripture might be fulfilled.**

While it is clear that the scripture is fulfilled with the loss of the son of perdition, because there are a number of scriptures that foretold his defection and betrayal

Jesus is saying that He has kept all the ones that were given to him.

But in order to explain the betrayal of Judas and the defection of Judas, He says the only one that left is the one by nature was a son of destruction or ruin.

NOT a believer.

This was part of the plan.

John 6:70–71 (NKJV)

⁷⁰ Jesus answered them, “Did I not choose you, the twelve, and one of you is a devil?” ⁷¹ He spoke of Judas Iscariot, *the son* of Simon, for it was he who would betray Him, being one of the twelve.

John 13:18 (NKJV)

¹⁸ “I do not speak concerning all of you. I know whom I have chosen; but that the Scripture may be fulfilled, ‘*He who eats bread with Me has lifted up his heel against Me.*’

But that is not all that is being referenced here, and in fact, I would argue that it is not the primary point, but rather that the Scripture is being fulfilled in the keeping of the ones that have been given to the Son by the Father.

3. That Joy would be Full

The Savior would not only have His people safe in eternity, but He desires them to be happy here and now: He would have them enter into His joy. It was for this reason He had uttered this Prayer while He was here upon earth. How this reveals the affections of our great High Priest! He might have offered this Prayer in silence to the Father, so that we had known nothing of its gracious and comforting details. But that would not have satisfied the heart of the

Lord Jesus. He spoke audibly so that the apostles might hear Him, and He has caused it to be written down too, so that we also might know of His deep interest in us

4. That the Devil would be Defeated

15 I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one

The devil desire you. He desire to have you and destroy you. If he was allowed by God, he would

take as many as he could to hell, which would be all men who have ever lived.

He is allowed under the Rule of God to Seek out believers, to cause them to stumble, to tempt them with sin. But he is not allowed to fully destroy any believer. He has a fenced in area that he must remain in.

Could you imagine a world where there was equal power between God and the Devil and there was not assurance that you would ever truly and surely be saved. A life where one moment you are eternally saved, and then the next you are eternally lost.

The Bible teaches that the devil does have power, but he does not have all power.

The Bible teaches that the devil seeks out whom he may destroy, but it does not teach that he can destroy completely in hell.

The Bible teaches that the devil may be given permission to afflict us and tempt us but he is not given permission to take our souls.

Jesus intercession is a means of grace, that prohibits the devil from accomplishing his evil desires

John 17:15 (NKJV)

¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one.

2 Thessalonians 3:3 (NKJV)

³ But the Lord is faithful, who will establish you and guard *you* from the evil one.

Psalms 121:3–7 (NKJV)

³ He will not allow your foot to be moved;
He who keeps you will not slumber.

⁴ Behold, He who keeps Israel
Shall neither slumber nor sleep.

⁵ The Lord *is* your keeper;
The Lord *is* your shade at your right hand.

⁶ The sun shall not strike you by day,
Nor the moon by night.

⁷ The Lord shall preserve you from all evil;
He shall preserve your soul.

But also, add to this the accomplishment of the Cross

1 John 3:8 (NKJV)

⁸ He who sins is of the devil, for the devil has sinned from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil.

Colossians 2:15 (NKJV)

¹⁵ Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.

Hebrews 2:14 (NKJV)

¹⁴ Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil,

1 Peter 1:4–9 (NKJV)

⁴ to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, ⁵ who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

⁶ In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, ⁷ that the genuineness of your faith, *being* much more precious than gold that perishes, though

it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, ⁸ whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see *Him*, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, ⁹ receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of *your* souls.
