SCRIPTURE: Eccl. 4

SINGING: 179:1-4-405:1, 34, 6, 7-388:1-5-370:1-2

Ps. 104 is divinely inspired poetic commentary on the Creator's Creation!

- A. It declares that the earth is full of God's riches (vs. 24): what riches?
- B. We considered God's testimony in the ants and conies
 - 1. The ants remind us of Paul's 3 F's to Timothy (1 Tim. 6:11-12)
 - 2. The conies remind us of David's trust in the Rock (Ps. 31:1; 71:16)

III. God's Sermon in the Locust (Prov. 30:27)

- A. One locust is small and no threat to us: yet they overcome us by wisdom!
 - 1. What is their wisdom?
- B. A band of locusts God's sermon to exhort and encourage us
 - 1. Locust are united without a king: Christians often divided with the King!
 - a. Phil. 1:27 Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that (...) ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the Gospel. (Also Eph. 4:1-6)
 - b. The believers' work is first to band together to do Kingdom's work
- C. Locusts' wisdom gives direction to face one of 2020's greatest challenge
 - 1. What is one of the greatest challenges of 2020?
 - 2. What does Scripture teach us how to combat this human need?
 - a. that spiritual communion with God doesn't cancel this need: Gen. 2:18

- b. that every human being needs a family to love and to be loved
 - God's Kingdom is always spoken about as a family (Luke 8:21; Eph. 2:19-20; 3:14-15)
- c. that a church family ought to be a family for our lonely neighbors
 - Ex. 22:21-22; Lev. 19:34; Ps. 68:6
 - d. that we need **real** people to trust/confide in (Eccl. 4:9-12)
 - Heb. 10:24-25 is exhorting to encourage each other
 - Gal. 6:10; 1 Thess. 3:12, 5:15 sets out God's mandate for His people to be *front-runners*

IV. God's Sermon in the Spider (Prov. 30:28)

- A. A spider is one of God's engineering marvels
- B. Solomon chose the spider to picture exceeding wisdom: what is their wisdom?
 - 1. Is it their unique abilities?
 - 2. Is it their patient endurance waiting for a meal?
 - 3. Is it their perseverance to get in the best places?
 - Prov. 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? He shall stand before kings, he shall not stand before mean (unknown) men.
- C. Are you as persevering and diligent to dwell in palace of the King?
 - 1. We are as unfit in God's palace as the spider in Solomon's (John 3:3)
 - 2. Yet there is way we can and may enter to live in God's palace!
 - John 10:9 I am the door: by Me if any man enter in, He shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture
