¹ Not many of you should become teachers, my siblings, for you know that we who teach	
will be judged with greater strictness.

² For we all <i>stumble</i> in many ways.	
And if anyone does not stumble in what he says,	
he is a <i>perfect</i> man, able also to bridle his whole body.	
³ If we put <i>bits</i> into the mouths of horses so that they obey us,	
we guide their <i>whole bodies</i> as well.	
⁴ Look at the <i>ships</i> also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds,	
they are guided by a very small rudder	
wherever the will of the pilot directs.
