Things to do: (Wayne Mack)

- 1. Expect of your children what they are capable of accomplishing.
- 2. Discipline them for the glory of God and their good.
- 3. Practice what you preach. Children can spot a fake, and it drives them nuts when it is their parents.
- 4. Lead your children with prayer first, personal example second, and then rules for them to keep. It is, follow me as I follow Christ.
- 5. Cultivate joy in your family life. Positive encouragement, family fun, togetherness; bind your family together with the cords of love. That is nurture.
- 6. Freely express love and affection as a married couple and for your children. Love them; each of them. As parents, freely express love to each other in front of the children; dance in the kitchen; sing the praises of your spouse in front of the children.
- 7. Allow your children to try and fail; to learn and grow; and still love and accept them. Forgive them.
- 8. Make reasonable rules and have sensible expectations for your children
- 9. Admit your mistakes and ask forgiveness for them. Live the gospel in front of your children.
- 10. Be approachable for your children. If they have a problem, concern, doubt, fear; try to be sure that they will come to you first.

We are to provide for our children:

Economically, emotionally, spiritually nourish them.
