FACTOR #1: ELIJAH WAS PHYSICALLY
1) Elijah had a contest with the 450 prophets of on the top of Mt. Carmel before the people of Isra
Elijah's entire existence & ministry hung in the balance that entire day; it would have been draining
2) After Elijah won the contest, he led in the of the 450 men as false prophets with sword or ston
3) Elijah then faced his most powerful enemy, King Ahab, and ran before his chariot for miles to Jezre
4) When this day was over, Elijah suffered from exhaustion,and thirst—the first step toward the ca
5) The Bible pictures us as body-spirit unities; we do not fully understand how our bodies affect our
FACTOR #2: ELIJAH WAS IN THE AFTER THE MOUNTAINTOP
1) In this world the valley follows the mountaintop; after day comes; after the huge wave is the trough
2) Elijah was caught in this cycle: he believed that winning the contest on Mt Carmel would bring revival but the
threat frombrought him back to reality—it was the valley after the mountaintop & he was not prepare
3) Many Christians are regularly unprepared to face harshafter the emotional high of the mountainted
FACTOR #3: ELIJAH ISOLATED HIMSELF FROM STRENGTHENING
1) Perhaps Elijah left his servant in Beersheba because he valued his and did not want to endange
2) Perhaps Elijah thought bringing his servant along would make running from Ahab & Jezebel more
3) Perhaps Elijah wanted to be with God on Mt. Horeb/Mt. Sinai, where God had often revealed Hims
4) Whatever his reasons, he made a bad ; v. 10 indicates how dramatically Elijah felt his alonene
5) Often when we are headed into discouragement/depression, we find reasons not to be with God's
FACTOR #4: ELIJAH INDULGED IN
1) Self-pity is always focused on —all 3 phrases Elijah used in his prayer focused on himse
a) "I have had enough" b) "Now Lord take MY —it's is not worth living" c) I am no better than my father
When we are stubbornly self-focused rather thanfocused or others-focused, we are headed to the ca
2) Self-pity always distorts—Elijah saw Jezebel as big and God as small, the opposite of the true
It is impossible to focus on God andat the same time; we can only look through one end of the sco
FACTOR #5: ELIJAH WAS MISHANDLING
1) Throughout this story, Elijah seems to be; his statements in verses 4 and 10 make this cle
2) It is a natural, human reaction: pain engenders both of these issues run through this sto
3) Perhaps unconsciously Elijah sought out on Mt. Horeb to express his anger; anger took him to the ca
4) Often anger is the genesis of; often if we go back to beginning of depression, we will find ang
CONCLUSION: These factors can lead us toward the cave, but they cannot force us in it; we do that ourselve
by our responses to these factors. So we can conduct ourselves out of the cave by responding to
