	a. The Passover commemorated God's deliverance of the Jews from their in Egypt when, by the blood of a lamb, God passed over their homes and did not bring the judgment of death on their firstborn sons.
	b. The Feast of Unleavened Bread commemorated the cleansing of the house of leaven and powerful and immediately effective deliverance from Egyptian slavery.
