Daleth: My soul clings to the dust; Revive me according to Your word.

He: Teach me, O LORD, the way of Your statutes, And I shall keep it to the end.

Waw: Let Your mercies come also to me, O LORD—Your salvation according to Your word.

Zayin: Remember the word to Your servant, Upon which You have caused me to hope.

Heth: You are my portion, O LORD; I have said that I would keep Your words.

Teth: You have dealt well with Your servant, O LORD, according to Your word.

Yod: Your hands have made me and fashioned me; Give me understanding, that I may learn

Your commandments.

Kaph: My soul faints for Your salvation, But I hope in Your word.

Lamed: Forever, O LORD, Your word is settled in heaven.

Mem: Oh, how I love Your law! It is my meditation all the day.

Nun: Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path.

Samek: I hate the double-minded, But I love Your law.

Ayin: I have done justice and righteousness; Do not leave me to my oppressors.

Pe: Your testimonies are wonderful; Therefore my soul keeps them. Tsadde: Righteous *are* You, O LORD, And upright *are* Your judgments.

Ooph: I cry out with my whole heart; Hear me, O LORD! I will keep Your statutes.

Resh: Consider my affliction and deliver me, For I do not forget Your law.


Shin: Princes persecute me without a cause, But my heart stands in awe of Your word.

Tau: Let my cry come before You, O LORD; Give me understanding according to Your

word.


