 - 2. A word from Spurgeon on suffering
 - 3. Paul's experience in Ephesus (1 Cor 16:8-9)
 - 4. Know that 'ministry is war!' (P. Tripp)
 - 5. Beware of corporate warfare against the church where
 - a. Christ is no longer preached
 - b. Compromise with the world is permitted
 - c. Sin is tolerated in the ranks (not disciplined)
 - d. Programs and activities replace worship
 - e. Self replaces Christ as focus (self-esteem, purpose, etc)
 - 6. This can be avoided by maintaining a theology of the cross
