<sup>"6</sup> constantly nourished on the words of the faith and of the sound doctrine which you have been following. <sup>7</sup> But have nothing to do with worldly fables fit only for old women."

#### 2. A Good Servant Exercises \_\_\_\_\_ (vv. 7-9)

<sup>"7b</sup> On the other hand, discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness; <sup>8</sup> for bodily discipline is only of little profit, but godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come.<sup>9</sup> It is a trustworthy statement deserving full acceptance."

"A man without self-control is like a city broken into and left without walls 1 • Corinthians 9:27but I discipline my body and make it my slave..." (Proverbs 25:28)

- 7. A Good Servant Fulfills God's \_\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 14) "<sup>14</sup> Do not neglect the spiritual gift within you, which was bestowed on you through prophetic utterance with the laying on of hands by the presbytery."
- 8. A Good Servant is with Ministry and Growth (v. 15) "<sup>15</sup> Take pains with these things; be absorbed in them, so that your

progress will be evident to all."

9. A Good Servant is About the Right Priorities (v. 16) <sup>"16</sup> Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; persevere in these things, for as you do this you will ensure salvation both for yourself and for those who hear you. Watch your life and doctrine."
