Exodus 20:12

The Good Gift of Divine Authority

"Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you."

1. God Establishes Lines of Authority.

2. The Land Represented Heaven on Earth.

3. We Are God's Authorized Outposts for the Kingdom of God.

CONCLUSION: Our parents are gifts from God. Great parents. Horrendous parents. Gifts from a gracious God who is more concerned with our eternal conformity to Christ than our temporary experiences of familial bliss or horror. God is good. He has not only given us our parents, but established authoritative relationships in a fallen world to restrain chaos and anarchy. Even though positions of power can and are abused, we can trust Christ to work through them for His good purposes. Let us honor Christ through honoring those in positions of authority appropriately.

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 124. Who are meant by *father and mother* in the fifth commandment?

A. By father and mother, in the fifth commandment, are meant, *not only natural parents*, but all *superiors* in age and gifts; and especially such as, by God's ordinance, are *over us in place of authority*, whether in *family*, *church*, or *commonwealth*.

Q. 125. Why are superiors styled father and mother?

A. Superiors are *styled* father and mother, both to teach them in all duties towards their inferiors, like natural parents, to express love and tenderness to them, according to their several relations; and to work inferiors to a *greater willingness and cheerfulness in performing their duties to their superiors*, as to their parents.

Q. 126. What is the *general scope* of the fifth commandment?

A. The general scope of the fifth commandment is the performance of those duties which we mutually owe in our several relations, as inferiors, superiors, or equals.

Q. 127. What is the *honor* that *inferiors* owe to their *superiors*?

A. The *honor* which inferiors owe to their superiors is, *all due reverence in heart, word, and behavior*; prayer and thanksgiving for them; imitation of their virtues and graces; willing obedience to their lawful commands and counsels; due submission to their corrections; fidelity to, defense and maintenance of their persons and authority, according to their several ranks, and the nature of their places; bearing with their infirmities, and covering them in love, that so they may be an honor to them and to their government.

Q. 128. What are the *sins of inferiors* against their superiors?

A. The *sins of inferiors against their superiors* are, all neglect of the duties required toward them; envying at, contempt of, and rebellion against, their persons and places, in their lawful counsels, commands, and corrections; cursing, mocking, and all such refractory and scandalous carriage, as proves a shame and dishonor to them and their government.

Q. 129. What is required of superiors towards their inferiors?

A. It is *required of superiors*, according to that power they receive from God, and that relation wherein they stand, to love, pray for, and bless their inferiors; to instruct, counsel and admonish them; countenancing, commending, and rewarding such as do well; and discountenancing, reproving, and chastising such as do ill; protecting, and providing for them all things necessary for soul and body: and, by grave, wise, holy, and exemplary carriage, to procure glory to God, honor to themselves, and so to preserve that authority which God hath put upon them.

O. 130. What are the *sins of superiors*?

A. The *sins of superiors* are, besides the neglect of the duties required of them, an inordinate seeking of themselves, their own glory, ease, profit, or pleasure; commanding things unlawful, or not in the power of inferiors to perform; counseling, encouraging, or favoring them in that which is evil; dissuading, discouraging, or discountenancing them in that which is good; correcting them unduly; careless exposing, or leaving them to wrong, temptation, and danger; provoking them to wrath; or in any way dishonoring themselves, or lessening their authority, by an unjust, indiscreet, rigorous, or remiss behavior.

Q. 131. What are the duties of equals?

A. The *duties of equals* are, to regard the dignity and worth of each other, in giving honor to go one before another; and to rejoice in each other's gifts and advancement, as their own.

Q. 132. What are the *sins of equals*?

A. The *sins of equals* are, besides the neglect of the duties required, the undervaluing of the worth, envying the gifts, grieving at the advancement or prosperity one of another; and usurping pre-eminence one over another.

O. 133. What is the reason annexed to the fifth commandment, the more to enforce it?

A. The *reason annexed* to the fifth commandment in these words, "that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee," is an express *promise of long life and prosperity*, as far as it shall serve for God's glory and their own good, to all such as keep this commandment.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

How can God expect us to honor authorities when some *abuse their authority*? Isn't the fifth commandment unreasonable in a fallen world? Does this commandment address more than just our parent-child relationships? How can we trust Christ if we have been broken by tyrants? Yet, *God commands us to bear the weight of their superior position*. He does so not to crush us, but as a gift for our ultimate benefit—trust.

DISCUSS What does it mean to honor your father and mother? How have you dishonored them or other God ordained authorities? How are you trusting Christ for forgiveness and power to honor them as you should? MEDITATE on Proverbs 1:8-9 with WLC #124-33. PRAY "Father, enable us to honor those we should!"

Tuesday

READ **Exodus 20:12**; **Ephesians 3:14-19**; **5:15-6:9**; **Psalm 119:49-64**. DISCUSS Why is God our rightful authority? How do we honor Him through honoring those whom He has ordained to positions of authority? Are we *always* to obey these authorities? Why or why not? How are you honoring Christ through your family, work, and community relationships? MEDITATE on **Proverbs 1:8-9** with WLC #124-33. PRAY, "Father, enable us to glorify You through our relationships."

Wednesday

READ Exodus 20:12; Romans 13:1-8; 2Corinthians 5:16-21; Psalm 119: 33-48. DISCUSS How are we to view civil authorities as God's ministers? Why? What does it mean for us to be Christ's ambassadors? MEDITATE on Proverbs 1:8-9 with WLC #124-33. PRAY, "Father, forgive us for our insecurity and fear!"

Thursday

READ Exodus 20:12; 1Tim 5:4-8; Matthew 27:11-13; Psalm 119:49-64. DISCUSS What should make us glad? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Proverbs 1:8-9 with WLC #124-33. PRAY, "Father, enable us to honor Your established authorities even as Christ did Pilate as governor. Teach us to trust You in all of life because of Jesus."

Friday

READ Exodus 20:12; Genesis 1:26-31; Romans 13:1-8; Ephesians 3:14-19; 5:15-6:9; 2Corinthians 5:16-21; 1Tim 5:4-8; Matthew 27:11-13; Psalm 119:49-64. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need!* MEDITATE on Proverbs 1:8-9 with WLC #124-33. PRAY that we at FCCW would *honor Christ together*.

Proverbs 1:8-9
