### **John 13:3-5, 14-15**

*Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands and that He had come forth from God and was going back to God, got up from supper and laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He girded Himself. Then He poured water into the basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded.*

*"If I, then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you."*

### **Colossians 3:12-13**

*So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you so also should you.*

### **Ephesians 4:1-3**

*Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing tolerance for one another in love, being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.*

### **Philippians 2:3-4**

*Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests but also for the interests of others.*

**Pride** points fingers and blames others.

**Humility** accepts responsibility.

**Pride** gets angry and defensive when others speak against me.

**Humility** evaluates and makes adjustments when needed.

**Pride** is envious, resentful, irritable.

**Humility** is patient, caring, supporting.

**Pride** uses its resources to serve self.

**Humility** uses its resources to serve others.

**Humility** focuses on what God deserves from me.

**Pride** is passionate about getting my will done.

**Humility** is passionate about God getting His will done in Me.
