Review of the first two beatitudes - Jesus blesses empty people

Blessed are the Meek

- 1. Meekness defined
- Meekness illustrated: Moses
 Living meekly before people who differ
 Living meekly under authority
 Living meekly before God
- 3. Meekness illustrated: Jesus chose meekness over power
- Meekness is not a virtue but a lack God helps those who *cannot* help themselves

They shall inherit the earth

- 1. Christians already have all things
- 2. The future certainty of our promised inheritance (Psalm 37:8-11)

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness

- 1. A word-picture of genuine hunger and thirst
- Do you hunger and thirst for righteousness? A self-diagnosis Do you see through your own false righteousness? Who do you aspire to be like? What is taking away your appetite? How do you pray?
- 3. What if you do not hunger and thirst for righteousness?
- 4. A transition verse Does this speak of imputed or imparted righteousness?

They shall be satisfied

- 1. A present reality I am satisfied with Christ alone
- 2. A future promise (Revelation 21:1-7)
