- 2. Read Deuteronomy 7:21-26.
- A. Summarize what the Israelites were to expect God to do, regarding the Promised Land, if they obeyed Him. See Deuteronomy 7:12-26.

B. Knowing that God had announced this after the Israelites had seen God do amazing things such as: the 10 plagues, the cloud of fire, the parting of the sea, provision of food, provision of water, Mt. Was Joshua's obedience to God important for his success or failure? ____ What about his personal knowledge and reliance on God's Word? ____ What about you as parent, grandparent, friend, spouse, etc. in what ways could the commands of God given to the leader of Israel be of benefit to your influence of others that are in your life?
- 4. What is emphasized as a consequence of Joshua's leadership of Israel? Read Judges 2:6-7.
