Redemption and Reconciliation

• Redemption: From the Greek apolutrosis (ap-ol-oo'-tro-sis) "to purchase, to pay a ransom in full"

Prophesied

Job 19:25

25 "As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives,

And at the last He will take His stand on the earth.

Isaiah 44:22

22 "I have wiped out your transgressions like a thick cloud

And your sins like a heavy mist.

Return to Me, for I have redeemed you."

Isaiah 62:12

The Price of Our Redemption: The Blood of Christ

- Application in our ministry:
- Soberness and Seriousness in our approach to the ministry. *Acts* 20:28

28 "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you <u>overseers</u>, to shepherd the <u>church of God</u> which <u>He purchased with His own</u> blood.

- We free our disciples from the law and instead motivate them to love Jesus.
- We warn our disciples that they are not free agents and should separate themselves from sin. They belong to God and the represent God as members of His family, as His children here on earth.
- Reconciliation NT:2644 katallage (kat-al-lag-ay'); restoration to divine favor.
 Introduction:

- Many of the Epistles begin with as in Galatians 1:3 "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,".
- In fact this occurs so often (over 15 times) that we tend to skim over it in our Bible studies.
- Yet this "peace" is made possible by the Doctrine of Reconciliation.
- It is no small thing that God who was angry with us, who considered us enemies, is now totally at peace with us.

The Problem:

Ephesians 2:3

3 Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were <u>by nature children of wrath</u>, even as the rest. Romans 5:8-11

8 But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet <u>sinners</u>, Christ died for us.

9 Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved <u>from the</u> wrath of God through Him.

10 For if while <u>we were enemies</u> we were <u>reconciled to God through the death</u> of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

11 And not only this, but we also exult in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation.

Colossians 1:21

- The Blood of Christ

Colossians 1:19-20

• The Death of Christ (Many view the death of Christ as an afterthought)

• Application in our lives

Colossians 1:21-23

• Application in our ministry

2 Corinthians 5:17-21

18 Now all these things are from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation,

19 namely, that God was in <u>Christ reconciling the world to Himself</u>, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us <u>the word of reconciliation</u>.

20 Therefore, we are <u>ambassadors for Christ</u>, as though God were making an appeal through us; <u>we beg you on behalf of Christ</u>, be reconciled to God.

21 He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

- It is all about Jesus
- The Reconciliation talked about in this passage is not bringing peace to the world, peace within the church, helping people to get along, but rather reconciling the lost, who are enemies with God to God. To bring peace with God to their lives through salvation in Christ.
- Realizing the depth of the enmity, wrath and impending judgment of God on His enemies, we aggressively appeal. Romans 5:8 is true but it goes beyond "sinners" to we were "enemies" of God facing the "wrath" of God.

Luke 14:23-24

23 "And the master said to the slave, 'Go out into the highways and along the hedges, and <u>compel them</u> to come in, so that my house may be filled. Acts 2:40

40 And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on <u>exhorting</u> them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

Acts 18:4

4 And he was reasoning in the synagogue every Sabbath and <u>trying to persuade</u> Jews and Greeks.

Acts 19:8

8 And he entered the synagogue and continued speaking out boldly for three months, reasoning and <u>persuading them</u> about the kingdom of God. Acts 28:23

23 When they had set a day for Paul, they came to him at his lodging in large numbers; and he was explaining to them by solemnly testifying about the kingdom of God and trying to persuade them concerning Jesus, from both the Law of Moses and from the Prophets, from morning until evening.

1 Thessalonians 2:11

11 just as you know how we were exhorting and encouraging and <u>imploring</u> each one of you as a father would his own children,

- The ministry of Reconciliation knows nothing of the passive, tentative, almost apologetic approach to the Gospel. It knows nothing of the presentation of facts in an unemotional way and then standing by and watching if the soul is born again or tumbles into the eternal flames of Hell. The ministry of Reconciliation includes an impassioned appeal to the lost.
- It is important for us to understand and the lost to understand, that we are not trying to Reconcile man to God but we are offering God's Reconciliation to man. It is not we want you to be Reconciled to the concept of God and believe in Him, but rather if you do not receive Christ and become Reconciled with God you are going to Hell.
