

Unholy Forces Shape Society **by Fred DeRuvo – Study-Grow-Know Ministries**

I recall when the TV animated show *Family Guy* started. It seemed okay to watch. However, it was not long before just about everything in the show became laced with sexual innuendo. In fact, much of it was not even innuendo but outright statement.

This has happened with any number of shows that start off relatively fine, but quickly turn into something that seems to have clawed its way out of the pit of hell. This is what people watch and *enjoy* today. It is part of their normal, daily lifestyle.

Movies and television shows have a sneaky way of forcing their views on people. They do not do this by having someone sit in a chair and talk *at* the viewer. People would reject that out of hand if they did not agree with the position of the speaker (besides which it would be extremely boring). Movies and television shows consistently present opinions, attitudes, and demeanors as *normal* within given situations around which the main actors engage. There is always a way in which things that have long been on the outskirts of society find a way into the more routine areas of that society.

This is most obvious with the Gay and Lesbian watchdog groups. Over the past several decades, gays and lesbians have been portrayed as individuals with lifestyles that simply need to be accepted for who they are as people. There is nothing wrong with accepting people as people, but the problem is that many of these same TV shows and movies portray the religious person as the *persecutor* of the gay individual.

The stereotypical religious legalist is one of the favored antagonists of today. They are easy to hate. These shows will then have a *liberal* religious person who enters with a “live and let live” or “love all people” approach to show that it is the *liberal* religious person who really understands what love is all about. The legalist should be shunned. What is missing is the way Jesus would have approached the issue. He would have offered salvation and then said, “*Go and sin no more.*” This position does not play well on TV or in movies, since it is difficult to agree with that position. Moreover, the concept of “sin” is not something that most want to hear about or entertain thoughts of.

The basic formula in most movies and TV shows is to set up the problem with an antagonist, normally coming against someone that the audience can see as the *underdog*. Once the show has set the parameters, the audience naturally follows along as if they are watching *real life* happen right in front of them. Of course, they are simply watching a script unfold, but that makes no difference to the audience. The people in the audience

invest their emotions into the scenes and it is from those *emotions* that they make their decisions.

The better the script and actors, the better the emotional response from the viewer. Once this is replicated times 1,000 over the course of several years, what began as a seed planted in the mind has grown into a solid oak tree. People no longer ask *why* they believe something. They simply *believe* it because it *feels* right. Their rationale is based on how they have grown to feel about something and that stems from the quality of the presentation they have witnessed repeatedly.

I recall Jim and Tammy Faye Bakker's son Jay, who not long ago said that God *revealed* to him that homosexuality was *not* wrong. It goes without saying that the way in which God apparently revealed this to Jay was *extra-biblically* through the realm of emotions. In other words, it was not through Jay's study of Scripture that he came to this new understanding, but through his subjective *feelings*. It is now his passion to stand up for gays and lesbians. Where did he get that idea? Most likely from his mother, who was friends with many gays, especially after the entire debacle occurred when the PTL Club and ministries were taken from the Bakkers and Jim went to jail for his sexual proclivities. You reap what you sow and Jay is the result of his parents' thinking and teaching.

So when something like Prop 8 comes along in California, anyone who is in favor of Prop 8 (marriage is between one man and one woman) is seen as a *hater*. This is the way the media plays with people's beliefs, by playing to their *emotions*. It's really simple and it is a formula that works.

This has been the norm for the talk show heads and pundits on the liberal side of the aisle who do not like Sarah Palin, or prefer to attack FOX News as being liars.
