Solus Christus

Jesus condemns the leavened, "sign-seeking" doctrine of the religious leaders Matthew 16:1-12

- I. Reformation clarity on the Roman Catholic teaching of "Christ plus saints"
- II. Jesus changes the attention on "Christ plus miracles" to Christ alone (16:1-4)

The Pharisees and Sadducees' malicious question to tempt Jesus (1)

They missed the clear signs of the kingdom already given by Christ (2-3)

Jesus condemns sign-seeking (4)

Evil (vicious) and adulterous (covenant-breaking)

The "sign of Jonah" (the Gospel)

III. Jesus changes the source of authority of teaching from the religious leaders to Himself (16:5-12)
Jesus condemns the *"leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees"* (5-6)

The confusion over what was meant by "leaven" (7)

Jesus expects spiritual-mindedness from his disciples (8-11)

The disciples' "aha moment" (12)

IV. Leaven in the church today

Sadducee-like leaven of the "religious left" (Liberalism, social justice, emerging church) Pharisee-like leaven of the "religious right" (holiness movements, legalism, politics)

IV. Epilogue and Coming Attractions

Peter confesses solus Christus (16:13-16)

Jesus teaches solus Christus is greater than the whole world (16:24-26)

It will still be solus Christus on Judgment Day (16:27-28)

God demonstrates solus Christus at the Mount of Transfiguration (17:1-8)

V. Conclusion: The 5 solae in a pluralistic society that hates the very idea of "solus"
