Sermon: Hebrews 11:32-34 Part 1

1. Modern Israel is a nation that has one of the lowest number of Christians on earth. They consist of 2% Christian, 9% Atheists, 75% Jewish, and the rest is a mixture of other religions. A. According to these numbers, if God judged the nation as He did in the book of Judges how would they fare?

2. Some modern Christians believe that they are to support Israel at all cost no matter what Israel is doing because they are “God’s people and God’s nation,” who can do no wrong? Is this the description that we find of Israel in the book of Judges? See Judges 2:12-15, etc.

3. The nation of Israel disobeyed God reaped the consequences for breaking the covenant that God had made with them. Read over the consequences for obedience and disobedience to God found in Deut. 8. A. According to this passage, when would the Israelites be the most tempted to turn their back on God?

B. What about people today, should we be aware that success in this world can often be a snare?

4. As has been seen throughout Exodus and now in Judges, not all who belonged to Jacob (Israel) had faith. Jesus revealed this as well (8:39-47). We often see this lesson taught in the Bible. Read Acts 14:1-7. What nationalities believed Paul’s gospel message, and what nationalities did not believe? What does this mean?

6. True faith is revealed through obedience. Israel’s lack of faith was revealed through various tests. God put them in various scenarios and their faith, or lack of faith was revealed. The book of Exodus, Joshua, and Judges reveal that they were tested when they were scared, hungry, thirsty, poor, and even the opposite when they were well fed and prosperous. In other words, testing is not only when things are bad, but when they are good as well. What are some practical things that you can put in place in your life that can help you to consistently trust in God through every and all situations?
