Amen: Verily; True; Faithful; Absolute Confidence and Trust; So Be It

The Expectation of Effects from the Exhortation: Transformed lives that stand firm in the faith.

We do not do good works and God's will in order to be at peace with Him. We cannot do good works or His will unless we have already received His peace and been reconciled to Him through His Son. Apart from His intervention, we cannot change ourselves or conduct ourselves as He requires. But by His power and provision, He equips, enables, and exhorts us to do all that we do through Christ, to Christ, and for the glory of Christ alone.
