Scripture: Deut. 5:1-21 & Proverbs 30

Question: Why did Jesus create so many animals?

Four Sermons in Four Small Animals

I. The Sermon of the Ant (Prov. 30:25 & Prov. 6:6-8)

- A. Ants are not strong compared to us people
- B. Yet they are *exceeding wise*: what is their wisdom?
 - 1. Is it their ant-house (hill) they build together?
 - 2. Is it their working together? (Prov. 6:7)
 - 3. It is their wisdom is to be ready for the winter
- C. In each ant God asks: *Are you preparing like the ant?*
 - Is. 55:6 Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near
 - Eccl. 12:1 Remember now (!) thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil day come not, nor the years draw night, when thou shalt say, I have not pleasure in them.

II. The Sermon of the Conies (Prov. 30:26; Ps 104:18)

- A. Conies are feeble: why?
- B. Yet they also are exceeding wise: what is their wisdom?
 - **1.** They are alert (together)
 - Prov. 22:3 A prudent (careful, wise) man forseeth the evil and hideth himself: but the simple (foolish) pass on, and are punished.
 - 2. They flee at slight shriek of the watch-cony
 - Prov. 14:16 A wise man feareth (is cautious), and departeth from evil: but the fool rageth (careless) and is confident (arrogant)
 - 3. They hide in the rocks
 - Is. 32:1 And a man shall be as an hiding place from the wind, and a covert from the tempest; as rivers of water in a dry place, as the shadow of a great rock in a weary land.

- B. Are you wise like the conies in fleeing to Jesus Christ?
 - 1. We need Him as our cover against God's holy justice
 - 2. We need to flee to Him and place our trust in Him
 - Prov. 12:28 In the way of righteousness is life; and in the pathway therefore there is no death
 - Prov. 8:35 For whoso findeth me findeth life, and shall obtain favour of the LORD

III. The Sermon of the Locust (vs. 27)

- A. A locust (grasshoppers) is small and no threat to any
- B. Yet they overcome their weakness with wisdom: unity
 - 1. Nothing is more destructive than an army of locust (Joel 1:1-7; 2:1-11)
- C. How is their wisdom of banding together a sermon?
 - 1. Without a king they unite in their fight
 - 2. We have the best King: will we unite to fight under Him and for Him?

IV. The Sermon of the Spider (vs. 28)

- A. A spider is one of God's engineering marvels
- B. Solomon chose the spider to picture exceeding wisdom: what is their wisdom?
 - 1. Is it their unique abilities?
 - 2. Is it their patient endurance waiting for a meal?
 - 3. It is their perseverance to get in the best places
 - Prov. 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? He shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean (unknown) men.
- C. Are you as persevering and diligent to dwell in palace of the King?
 - 1. We are as unfit in God's palace as the spider in Solomon's (John 3:3)
 - 2. Yet there is way we can and may enter and live in God's palace!
 - John 10:9 I am the door: by Me if any man enter in, He shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture
