Theme: You have reasons to always be rejoicing.

What is the one point I am trying to get across? We often seem to find reasons to complain, so let's find reasons to rejoice

I. You always have a reason to rejoice – God's presence (vv. 4, 5) When God commands us to rejoice He never does so without explaining why (1 Thess 5:18; James 1:2, 3; 1 Peter 1:5-7)

The Lord is at hand – Near (place or time), nigh, ready

II. You always have a reason to rejoice – your persistence (vv. 4,5)

Moderation – quiet peaceableness (not insisting on just rights), gentle, suitable

Literally it would read, "Let be known unto all men your moderation" OR "Allow to be know unto all men your moderation"
