Proverbs 13:1 A **wise son** heareth his father's

instruction: But a **SCOrner** heareth not rebuke.

- 1. Will you listen? 1 A **wise son** heareth his father's instruction: But a **scorner** heareth not rebuke.
  - a. It is pride that keeps you from listening and learning
     10 Only by pride cometh contention: But with the well advised is wisdom.
    - i. The "know it all" just causes problems
    - ii. The wise learns by listening and considering
    - iii. Find and speak to many wise because in the multitude of counsel is wisdom
  - b. God gave His Word to bless you 13 Whoso despiseth the word shall be destroyed: But he that feareth the commandment shall be rewarded.
    - i. If you will not listen to it you will be destroyed
      - 1. It has great insight in how to live now
        - a. How to lead your family

- b. How to be a man
- c. How to pay your bills
- d. How to work
- 2. Most of all it will determine where you will spend eternity
  - a. Be careful to teach your children the Bible
  - b. They need
- ii. Showing respect to the Word of God will bring great rewards to you both here and now as well as when life ends and begins again
- c. Know where to get instruction 14 The law of the wise is a fountain of life, To depart from the snares of death.
  - i. Go to wise people, those that love God, respect Him, know His Word
  - ii. Where you choose to get instruction will determine how life goes
  - iii. Get your children in church where they can hear and learn the Word of God
  - iv. Be careful to be wise as you lead your family that they will know the Word of God

- d. If you will learn and understand then doors will open to you 15 Good understanding giveth favour: But the way of transgressors *is* hard.
  - i. Going against the Lords will only makes your way hard
  - ii. People will soon decide if you understand, have good sense etc
- e. The wise man, the understanding, thoughtful man makes wise decisions 16 Every prudent *man* dealeth with knowledge: But a fool layeth open *his* folly.
  - i. The fool soon shows who he is
  - ii. Whether or not you listen and learn will soon be obvious to all
- f. Your attitude towards instruction determines much of your success or failure 18 Poverty and shame *shall be to* him that refuseth instruction: But he that regardeth reproof shall be honoured.
  - i. You can lose it all if you will be taught
  - ii. You can have success and honor if you will simply get instruction

- g. Choose your friends wisely 20 He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: But a companion of fools shall be destroyed.
  - i. If you are with those that refuse to listen then you will probably develop that same attitude
  - ii. You become like those that you associate with
  - iii. Whiners love whiners and produce more whiners
  - iv. Winner love winners and produce more winners
  - v. Your chosen environment has more to do with who you are and what you become than you would ever want to believe
- h. When you do not discipline your child to listen you do them a disservice 24 He that spareth his rod hateth his son: But he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes.
  - If you do not discipline your children then you are telling them that you do not love them
  - ii. Discipline and guidelines show love
  - iii. If you care then you do what is best for them and not necessarily what makes them happy
  - iv. You better get started young

- v. Do not listen to popular, politically correct, teaching but the Word of God
- 2. The importance of words and the way you speak
  - a. Sticks and stones may break my bones but words will never hurt me!
  - b. Using your words correctly can give you good food to eat 2 A man shall eat good by the fruit of *his* mouth: But the soul of the transgressors *shall eat* violence.
    - i. You can desire helpful conversation and succeed
    - ii. or you can fuss, fight, and complain all through life
  - c. Get control of your mouth because how you use your mouth can bring success or destruction 3 He that keepeth his mouth keepeth his life: *But* he that openeth wide his lips shall have destruction.
    - If you are careful how you talk then you will be rewarded
    - ii. You can ruin things if you do not control your mouth
  - d. Living out who you are will cause you to tell the truth 5 A righteous man hateth lying: But a wicked man is loathsome, and cometh to shame.

- i. While God's people hate lies the wicked seems to love living in them
- ii. The lies will embarrass him sooner or later
- e. How you talk determines much of your success 17 A wicked messenger falleth into mischief: But a faithful ambassador *is* health.
  - If you talk stupid you will act stupid
  - ii. If you deal in truth and talk truth then you will have success
  - iii. You can help others be a success if you learn truth and share it
- 3. Work and quit dreaming
  - a. The diligent, hard worker, smart will prosper 4 The soul of the sluggard desireth, and *hath* nothing: But the soul of the diligent shall be made fat.
    - It doesn't matter how much you want but how much you work
    - ii. Be energetic, get at it and you will have something to show for your life
  - b. Trying to get money without working for it won't work
    —get rich schemes 11 Wealth gotten by vanity shall be

diminished: But he that gathereth by labour shall increase.

- i. Easy come easy go
- ii. Lottery wealth rarely makes wealth
- iii. Working hard and smart will cause you to increase in financial wealth
- c. Be ready when the opportunity arises 12 Hope deferred maketh the heart sick: But when the desire cometh, it is a tree of life.
  - Disappointments can break your heart
  - ii. But if you keep dreaming and working then great joy will come
- d. Work at doing what you dream of and desire 19 The desire accomplished is sweet to the soul: But *it is* abomination to fools to depart from evil.
  - i. Make sure and get the right desires
    - 1. the fool wants evil and will not turn from it
    - 2. right desires are going to be sweet to your soul
  - ii. God works in our desires Philippians 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.

- iii. If you get the right desires and work towards them you will have a satisfied life
- e. The potential to make money is there in what you have 23 Much food *is in* the tillage of the poor: But there is that is destroyed for want of judgment.
  - If you do not use your head and learn you will continue to be poor
  - ii. Crooked lawyers can ruin you financially
  - iii. Guys like Naboth can lose their vineyard to crooked queens and kings
- Living out who you are, righteousness will bring blessings on your life
  - a. Doing right will protect you 6 Righteousness keepeth him that is upright in the way: But wickedness overthroweth the sinner.
    - Living out what God has put in will give you a life of meaning
    - ii. If you allow this world, sin, self to rule then you will lose the very meaning of life

- b. God makes it clear when you live the life you were meant to live 9 The light of the righteous rejoiceth: But the lamp of the wicked shall be put out.
  - i. There is joy in living out who you are
  - ii. There is light and direction
  - iii. It will bring success
  - iv. But living your own selfish way will lead to destruction
- c. Who you are determines much of what will happen to you 21 Evil pursueth sinners: But to the righteous good shall be repayed.
  - i. The sinner is courting disaster
  - ii. Those that honor God will be blessed
- 5. The importance of money in your life
  - a. Be a giver 7 There is that maketh himself rich, yet hath nothing: There is that maketh himself poor, yet hath great riches.
    - i. Possibly you think that giving you cause you to lose money and get behind financially but that is not what this proverb says
    - ii. Real riches are not having money but using money

- iii. You can get money in the bank and be very poor
- b. Money can cause you risk 8 The ransom of a man's life are his riches: But the poor heareth not rebuke.
  - i. They will sue you for your money
  - ii. No one wants to bother the poor guy
- c. Pass on a good name and reputation more than worrying about passing on money 22 A good *man* leaveth an inheritance to his children's children: And the wealth of the sinner *is* laid up for the just.
- d. Get the right appetite and you will be satisfied 25 The righteous eateth to the satisfying of his soul: But the belly of the wicked shall want.
  - If what you want is what is right then you will be satisfied
  - ii. If you are seeking what you should not be seeking then you can expect to never be satisfied
  - iii. It is never money that satisfies
  - iv. It is never houses, things, cars but God and righteousness that satisfies
