Intro: Paul's worship about God's generosity: 2 Cor. 9:15

CHRISTIAN GENEROSITY

I. It blesses the needy II. It enriches the givers III. It is well pleasing to God

I. CHRISTIAN GENEROSITY BLESSES THE NEEDY

- A. Paul was also a needy man who appreciated the gifts of love (14-16)
 - Being content is not contradictory to being needy
 - 2. Therefore he felt deeply thankful for Philippians' ministry work a. seems vs. 14-16 are added to avoid misinterpretation
 - b. 2 Cor. 8:1-5 supplements the picture of this church family
- B. What a beautiful grace is this Christian generosity!
 - 1. It is God's grace flowing through His people's fellowship in action
 - 2. Though Christian generosity is a grace of God, it needs cultivation a. 2 Cor. 8:6-7; 10-11

II. CHRISTIAN GENEROSITY ENRICHES THE GIVERS

- A. Christian giving is a fruit that enriched the receivers (vs. 18)
- B. Yet Christian giving is also a fruit that enriches the givers (vs. 15-17)
 - 1. Paul adopted some business terms in his writing
 - 2. Though to our 'grace alone' mindset Paul's teaching sounds shocking yet is fully Biblical:
 - a. Matt. 6:19-21 Matt. 5:7 Prov. 11:15 19:17 Hebrews 6:10

- b. Matt. 25:31-46 Jesus allows us a peek into God's ledger
- 3. 2 Cor. 5:10 informs us about God's accounting day

III. CHRISTIAN GENEROSITY IS WELL PLEASING TO GOD

- A. God reveals He either grieved (Eph. 4:30) or pleased with His children: vs 18
- B. What an encouraging truth: God is delighted with efforts to do good works!
 - 1. Romans 12:1: to present your body as a living sacrifice is acceptable to Him
 - 2. Rom 14:18: serving Christ in Christian charity is well-pleasing
 - 3. 1 Tim. 2:1-3: praying for each other is well pleasing in sight of God
 - 4. 1 Peter 2:20: to suffer when you do well and take it patiently delights Him
 - 5. Col. 3:20: obeying your parents is well pleasing to the Lord.
- C. What about Isaiah 64:6: But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags?
 - 1. this applies to seeking justification before God on basis of your works
 - 2. But though good works have no value in the *court of justification*, they do have value in the *court of sanctification*

In the court of justification, good works are nothing worth, but in the court of sanctification, they are jewels and ornaments.
