- 6. What is the basis for the prohibition in the Second Commandment (9b)? Explain what this means.
- 7. What warning does God issue for those who would violate this commandment (v. 9c)?
- 8. What promise does God give for those who obey (v. 10)?

- 10. What does it mean to say that "all of life is worship"?
- 11. How is worship ordered the same whether it is in the broad sense or the narrow sense? How is worship ordered differently in these two areas?
- 12. What are examples of contrived worship of God that are not grounded in Scripture?
- 13. How does worship reduce to entertainment?
