Acceptance among Believers Philemon 1:10-20

We actively receive others through:

I. **F**ostering – "I beseech thee for my son" (vs. 10-13) Seeing believers as:

- A. Progeny "whom I have begotten in my bonds"
- **B.** *Profitable* "but now profitable to thee and to me"
- C. Precious "receive him that is, mine own bowels"

II. Figuring - "without thy mind would I do nothing" (vs. 14-16) *Stewarding:*

A. Property – "that thy benefit should not be as ...necessity"

B. Providence - "perhaps he departed for a season"

C. Position - "now...above a servant, a brother beloved"

III. Forgiving - "If he hath wronged thee" (vs. 17-20) *Sharing the:*

- A. Esteem "If thou count me therefore as a partner"
- **B.** Expense "I do not say...how thou owes unto me"
- C. Expectation "brother, let me have joy of you in the Lord"

<u>Sentence</u> Sermon:

"Let's receive one another as we would want our children to be received."
