WHEN PREACHING CHRIST CAUSES A CULTURE CLASH

Acts 19.21-41

We left off last time with the bonfires still burning...

- 1. Like Paul, we ought to have a desire **to go** with the gospel.
 - a. Everyone needs to have a **Rome** in mind.
 - b. Everyone needs to keep the **saints** in mind.
- 2. Like Paul we ought to expect <u>cultural</u> <u>opposition</u> (v.23-34
 - a. Demetrius stirred up **hatred** toward Christians (v.23-28).
 - i. He appealed to their possible **loss of income** (v.23-25).
 - ii. He appealed to their religious **loyalties** (v.26).
 - iii. He appealed to their sense of civic pride or **patriotism** (v.27)
 - b. Demetrius stirred the public to <u>raw</u> emotion.
 - i. **Anger** (v.28)
 - ii. **Confusion** (v.29-32)
 - iii. Racism (33-34).

3. Like Paul we ought to **rest** in God's protection (v.35-41).

Take this with you.

- 1) We need to see our **personal** Rome. There is always someone yet to reach with the gospel.
- Cultural change occurs <u>one person</u> at a time.
 Changed people change the <u>culture</u>. We should never be <u>intimidated</u> by the culture.
- 3) Christianity should have an impact on professions that feed off of superstition and **sin**.
- 4) Christians can expect <u>vicious opposition</u> from a world that hates our message and our Savior.
- 5) We can rest assured that God knows our **situation**.

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
