Confession of Sin and Assurance of Pardon

Call to Confession:

God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself. Therefore, we come, in the Reconciler's name, to claim spiritual healing within and among us.

[Silence]

Minister: Let us confess together our sin.

Congregation: Our Father in Heaven, we confess that we are born sinners and that we continue to sin against You, our God and Savior. Our only hope is to come to You in Jesus's name, and we do so now. Hear us for Christ's sake. Forgive us our many sins; our harsh words; our wicked thoughts; our false dealings. Teach us kindness, purity, and integrity. Our Father, lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen

Silent confession

Assurance of Pardon: (inspired by Micah 7:18-20)

Words of Invitation

Congregation of Jesus Christ:

You who trust in Christ alone for your salvation;

The Lord has prepared His table for you, and you are now invited to come and eat at the table
of the Lord.

People: ***We come with gladness. Thanks be to God!***

Institution

Hear the words of the institution of the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ: "For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, 'This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."

With thanksgiving, let us offer God our grateful praise.

Declaration of Thanksgiving

Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is good for us to give thanks and praise.

With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you created heaven and earth, made us in your image, and kept covenant with us—even when we fell into sin. We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, who by his life, death, and resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. While we were disobedient, he fulfilled all obedience. We thank you for the continued presence of the Holy Spirit with us made possible by the redeeming work of Jesus Christ.

Take and drink of eternal life in Christ through your faith in him.

And we'll join in the feast of heaven
