THE MAIN POINT OF GALATIANS 4:8–20

It pains gospel ministers to see
Christians drift from the true gospel.
Those who are drifting must be reminded
of the freedom that the gospel offers.

THE FREEDOMS THAT THE GOSPEL OFFERS GALATIANS 4:8–20

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- 2. The gospel offers the freedom of *loving others* out of love for Christ (verses 12–16).
- 3. The gospel offers the freedom of *craving good* (verses 17–20).
