# ORDER OF WORSHIP

Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. The gray boxes throughout the bulletin were written to aid each worshipper in thoughtful and meaningful participation in this dialogue. Please prepare your heart by reading through the bulletin, praying for those leading and worshipping around you, and silencing all communication devices.

We encourage parents to involve children as soon as possible in the worship service. In consideration of other worshippers, we request parents with children not yet ready for unobtrusive participation in worship to utilize the nursery or, if necessary, the cry room. A nursery is available for children ages 3 months to 3 years during all Sunday morning activities.

#### Prelude

Call to Worship

In this call to worship the psalmist reminds us that God has revealed His salvation and His righteousness to the nations unto the ends of the earth, as the book of Acts demonstrates, thus calling all the earth to praise Him! This praise is in anticipation of His judgment of the world, which will usher in the establishment of His righteousness in His creation forever.

Psalm 98 ESV Oh sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things! His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. <sup>2</sup> The LORD has made known his salvation; he has revealed his righteousness in the sight of the nations. <sup>3</sup> He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel. All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. <sup>4</sup>Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises! <sup>5</sup> Sing praises to the LORD with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody! 6 With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the LORD! 7 Let the sea roar, and all that fills it; the world and those who dwell in it! 8 Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills sing for joy together 9 before the LORD, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity.

#### \* Reading from the Law

We have examined this passage as our Reading from the Law before, and it is noteworthy that the focus of its exhortation is to listen to God's Word rather than occult sources of wisdom, which, interestingly enough, God's people were (and, surprisingly, are still) consistently tempted to consult.

#### Isaiah 8:16-22 ESV

<sup>16</sup> Bind up the testimony; seal the teaching among my disciples. <sup>17</sup> I will wait for the Lord, who is hiding his face from the house of Jacob, and I will hope in him. <sup>18</sup> Behold, I and the children whom the Lord has given me are signs and portents in Israel from the Lord of hosts, who dwells on Mount Zion. <sup>19</sup> And when they say to you, "Inquire of the mediums and the necromancers who chirp and mutter," should not a people inquire of their God? Should they inquire of the dead on behalf of the living? <sup>20</sup> To the teaching and to the testimony! If they will not speak according to this word, it is because they have no dawn. <sup>21</sup> They will pass through the land, greatly distressed and hungry. And when they are hungry, they will be enraged and will speak contemptuously against their king and their God, and turn their faces upward. <sup>22</sup> And they will look to the earth, but behold, distress and darkness.

The context of the psalmist's (and our) prayer for mercy and forgiveness is the constant pressure of the accusation of his enemy.

#### Assurance of Pardoning Grace

The crowning achievement of the work of Christ on our behalf is that He has triumphed over the Devil and his forces, the enemies of our souls ("rulers and authorities") by disarming them, thus putting them to open shame. Satan is a defeated foe.

#### Colossians 2:8-15 ESV

<sup>8</sup> See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ. <sup>9</sup> For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, <sup>10</sup> and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority. <sup>11</sup> In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, <sup>12</sup> having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead. <sup>13</sup> And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, <sup>14</sup> by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. <sup>15</sup> He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

Our souls often grow weary from the battle we wage for them against Satan and His accusations and temptations. But to call God a "refuge" should recall to our minds the cities of refuge in Old Testament Israel, to where those guilty of bloodshed could flee and be safe from execution, an apt picture of Christ, who is our true refuge, and in whom we can find true rest.

"A Halloween Meditation" [Part II] (Rev. Mike Biggs)

\* Acts 19:11-20 ESV

II And God was doing extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, 12 so that even handkerchiefs or aprons that had touched his skin were carried away to the sick, and their diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them. 13 Then some of the itinerant lewish exorcists undertook to invoke the name of the Lord lesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul proclaims." 14 Seven sons of a Jewish high priest named Sceva were doing this. 15 But the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and Paul I recognize, but who are you?" 16 And the man in whom was the evil spirit leaped on them, mastered all of them and overpowered them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. 17 And this became known to all the residents of Ephesus, both lews and Greeks. And fear fell upon them all, and the name of the Lord Jesus was extolled. 18 Also many of those who were now believers came, confessing and divulging their practices. 19 And a number of those who had practiced magic arts brought their books together and burned them in the sight of all. And they counted the value of them and found it came to fifty thousand pieces of silver. 20 So the word of the Lord continued to increase and prevail mightily.

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.

"A Halloween Meditation" [Part II] (Rev. Mike Biggs) Acts 19:11-20

Introduction:

What can we learn from this passage about Kingdom warfare?

 Kingdom warfare must be approached as essentially spiritual, vv. 11, 12.
A. God is spiritual.

B. The enemy is spiritual.

II. Kingdom warfare must be waged through faith, vv. 13-17.
