ανωθεν, anowthen adverb, again, anew, from above. Galatians 4:9, literal again Matthew 27:51, from top: "the veil of the temple was split from top to bottom"

γεννηθη, genneithei verb, aorist, passive, subjunctive, 3rd person, singular of the word γενναω means: of the father, beget begotten, generate, Matthew 1:2-16 of the mother, to bring forth, bear give birth, Luke 1:13, 57 to be born or produced, Matthew 2:1,4

δυναται, dunatai present, passive, indicative 3rd person, singular of δυναται, means to be able, since the word is after ou, means negated. Not be able, also mentioned in verse 4

πνευματοσ, pneumatos genetive, singular, neuter of the word pneuma, πνευμα. means: wind, air, breath, spirit. Although used with neuter article but in conjunction with masculine pronoun. Refer: John 14:16-18, 26, 15:26 and 16:7,8 Note: used interchangeable with the word *ο* παρακλειτος Means advocate or helper, both the article and the noun are masculine.
