Main idea: It is for Christ's sake that God saves children from their own sin. Introduction: More to maturity than a voice change.

1. The immaturity of Ishmael

- a. Mocking
 - i. Laugh with v.s. laugh at
 - ii. Be careful what example you set for little ones around you
- b. Would have to be sent away with his mother
- c. Would die first if they died
- 2. What God does for him
 - a. Gives him a concerned father and a praying mother
 - b. Puts him in just the right places
 - c. Listens to his crying
 - d. Is with him
 - e. Prospers him in the wilderness
 - f. Grows him into a mighty and married man
 - g. Grows him into a mighty nation—a nation from whom a multitude will be saved!
- 3. Why God does it
 - a. v13 "seed" must be read in light of v12 "seed"
 - b. This takes us back to ch 17—"walk before Me" (v1) and "live before You" (v18)
 - c. But it is in Isaac that the seed will be called, because it is through Isaac that Christ will come
 - d. God does it because of who He is (the promise-making, promise-keeping God), and because of who Christ is (the One in whom all of those promises are kept).

Conclusion: Christ Himself is the ground and assurance of all the good that we hope that God will do for us, and especially that God will do in us.
