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Sermon: **Leviticus 2:1-16**

*The grain offering is a gift to the LORD of the believer's daily work.*

We see:

1. The bringing of a gift pictures the covenant relationship with God.
2. The bringing of a gift of "grain" pictures the daily work of a believer being totally dedicated to God's service.
3. God's acceptance of this gift is through mediation and pictures His delight in our daily work.

## WESTMINSTER CONFESSION OF FAITH

### Chapter 16 – Of Good Works

**WCF 16.1** Good works are only such as God hath commanded in His holy Word,(1) and not such as, without the warrant thereof, are devised by men, out of blind zeal, or upon any pretense of good intention.(2)

**WCF 16.2** These good works, done in obedience to God's commandments, are the fruits and evidences of a true and lively faith:(1) and by them believers manifest their thankfulness,(2) strengthen their assurance,(3) edify their brethren,(4) adorn the profession of the Gospel,(5) stop the mouths of the adversaries,(6) and glorify God,(7) whose workmanship they are, created in Christ Jesus thereunto;(8) that, having their fruit unto holiness, they may have the end eternal life.(9)

**WCF 16.6** Notwithstanding, the persons of believers being accepted through Christ, their good works also are accepted in Him;(1) not as though they were in this life wholly unblameable and unreprovable in God's sight;(2) but that He, looking upon them in His Son, is pleased to accept and reward that which is sincere, although accompanied with many weaknesses and imperfections.(3)

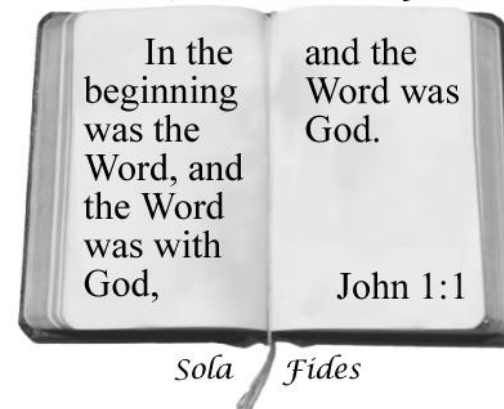
