A. Consider Ex. 25:8; 29:43; John 14:23; Rev. 3:20

B. Yet how can this be if even the heavens are not clean to Him? Job 15:15

## THE GOSPEL OF CHRIST'S LIFE AND DEATH (2)

- I. Redeems us from the demand of God's holy justice II. Covers us to be presentable before God's glory
- I. It redeems God's children from the demands of God's justice

A. Christ's life and death on the cross is central truth (Gal. 6:14; Conf. 23)

B. The story of Christ's life and death is also most powerful truth (Rom. 1:17) 1. The Holy Spirit uses the Gospel preaching to make sinners willing: Col. 1:6

## II. The Gospel of Christ's life & death will cover us before God's holy sight

- A. The reality of the Christian: righteous before God but unrighteous in self
- B. The Gospel provision of Christ: His life and His death as Mediator
  - 1. Though we cannot enough glorify God for Jesus' death on the cross, we must never omit to glorify God for Jesus' life on earth!
  - 2. Jesus Christ as High Priest covers each of His people before God's sight a. Eph. 1:6; 5:17; Jude 24

- b. Col 1:22 details this glorious truth
  - holy
  - unblameable
  - unreproveable
- C. A believer is called to live by *faith* instead of being defined by their *failures* 1. Recall Jesus' parting words: *John 14:1-3*, 27-28 along with *Col. 1:21-22* 
  - 2. Recall Jesus' promise that He will confess those before His Father who confess Him on earth (Matt. 10:32)
  - 3. Make use of Jesus' revelation about the Father's commitment, "If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him? (Luke 11:13)
