

The Book of Revelation – Structure and Themes

Following the Lord Jesus Christ’s resurrection and ascension upon His throne in heaven, and up until His second coming to judge the world is known as “The Gospel Age”. Also known as “these last times” 1 Peter 1:20. The risen glorified Son of God now reigns as Prophet, Priest and King of His Church and will soon be revealed to all men as the judge of all the earth. Having died for the sins of His elect, He is crowned with glory, see Psalm 110:1-5, Acts 2:34, Hebrews 1:13, Luke 20:39–43, Revelation 12:5. In this Gospel age, He is gathering His Church out of the world, by the ministry of His Word and by the instrumentality of the Holy Spirit, quickening and drawing all that God the Father gave Him {John 6:37} from before the foundation of the world. He reigns as Sovereign and Supreme working over all of nature, time and all events for the glory of God’s Name and His everlasting Kingdom, and for the good of His beloved bride the Church. He will then come again to raise the bodies of all men from the dust, and thus reuniting body and soul of all, and to pass final judgement on the wicked. Key Features. The man-child in Revelation 12:5 is the Lord Jesus Christ, who is the Lamb of God slain for the sins of His people and has been taken up to His throne until His final return. The dragon in Revelation 12:9 is Satan. The woman in the wilderness of Chapter 12:1-2, 14 is the Church, or the true bride. The first beast coming from the waters Rev 13:1 is the world and the world’s kingdoms see Daniel 7:1-15, the second beast, the false lamblike prophet who gives power to the first beast in the form of religious persecution. The Harlot that rides the beast is a pseudo-church, a pretentious bride and a postulating city mimicking the true Church and city of God, but is the Roman Catholic Church of Rome, called Babylon, “the mother of harlots” who says in Revelation 18:7, “I sit as a queen, and I am no widow”. This is not the language of the world but a false church, see Matthew 25:1-6. The Pope, in his perpetual and successive office is the head of the Catholic Church of Rome and is “the man of sin”, placing himself in the house of God and above Gods Word, as described in 2 Thessalonians 2:3. This position also accords with the 1689 London Baptist Confession of Faith Ch 26 par 4, and the Westminster Confession of Faith Ch 25 par 6.

The Book of the Revelation is structured into 7 cycles, thus giving different 7 clear aspects of events during the Gospel age beholding each from 7 vantage points.

All 7 cycles (as pictured below) run synchronously (*syn* meaning together) (*chronos* meaning time,) IE “at the same time” or in parallel with each other throughout the Gospel age.

The symbolism of the Gospel Age is consistently depicted by 1260 Days = 3 ½ years or 42 months. See Daniel 12:7, Revelation 11:2, Revelation 13:5, Revelation 11:11, Revelation 12:14.

The Church of God are God’s children and are identified in Scripture by the following titles: The elect, the bride of Christ, the true Israel, the circumcised in heart by a new birth. The Church is also referred to as the 24 elders, or the 144,000 and whose garments are made white in the blood of the Lamb and are taken from every kindred, tribe tongue and nation, Revelation 7:9.

The Church is the fulfilment of the promise of God the Father to the Lord Jesus Christ. See Psalm 2:8 and then confirmed by oath in covenant to Abraham, Genesis 22:17 see also Galatians 3:28–29
