At the End of Time
II Thessalonians 1:6-12

In the end, Jesus will:

I. Exclude – “you who are troubled rest with us” (vs. 6-8)

Those who are:

A. Hurtful – “to them that trouble you”

B. Heathen – “them that know not God”

C. Hebrew - “that obey not the gospel”

II. Execute - “who shall be punished” (v. 9)

Those who lose:

A. Worth – “Everlasting destruction ”

B. Worship - “from the presence of the Lord”

C. Wonder - “from the glory of His power”

III. Exalt - “our Lord Jesus Christ may be glorified” (vs. 10-12)

That which will be:

A. Mirrored – “glorified in His saints”

B. Marveled - “admired in all them that believe”

C. Manifested – “God would count you worthy of calling”

Sentence Sermon:
