PAUL'S TRIPLE TESTIMONY

I. He is confident II. He is needy II. He has single minded

I. Paul is confident

A. His confidence is expressed in his 'knowing' (vs. 19)

- 1. Almost sounds like the wrong word for so far nothing seems to go right
- 2. Yet Paul wrote I know

a. how can he be so confident - convinced?

b. Paul's testimony is God's reassuring us who look to God not to doubt

- B. What is he confident about?
 - 1. About his salvation

a. what is not meant with this (vs. 20-21)

- b. what is meant with this: his spiritual profit
- 2. How confident are we about God at work to perfect our salvation?

II. He is needy

A. Though confident, Paul is still dependent: vs. 19b

- 1. While Paul prayed for Phil, he also needed their prayer (1 Tim. 6:13-14)
- 2. Yet again he is confident and hopeful about the answer (Matt. 10:19,20)
- B. Paul's need is our need and Paul's request for help is to be ours also.

III. Paul is single-minded

- A. Paul did not focus on the deliverance of his trials: what then?
 - 1. vs. 20: *that in nothing I shall be ashamed but magnify Christ with boldness* a. what would shame Paul most?

b. what therefore did he intense crave the most as he faced the future?

- 2. His single-minded focus: *to magnify Christ (vs 20-21)* a. what is to magnify Christ?
 - b. why was this so important to Paul?
- B. Is our main concern and delight anywhere close to Paul's? (vs. 21)

Living the truth ...

A. Paul's answer on, *"What think ye of Christ?"* was not always vs. 21!1. What is your *personal* answer today?

- a. if unregenerate, Jesus is not more than a five-letter word
 - b. once regenerate, we die like Paul in Romans 7:9 For I was alive without the law once: but when the commandment came, sin revived, and I died.
 - c. when God reveals Jesus to us, we become like Paul: Phil. 3:8-10
- B. Why do we review this portrait of Saul-Paul?
