Free Paul Enslaved Himself

1 Corinthians 9:19 (LEB)

For although I am free from all people, I have enslaved myself to all, in order that I may gain more.

- Irony: being a slave to all made Paul free!
- "Gain" is *kerdaino_* is used 5 times in vss 19-23 and can also be translated "win"

- "All" is used 5 times in these verses
- "in order that" hina is used 7 times

An Example of Being a Slave to All <u>1 Corinthians 9:20 (LEB)</u>

I have become like a Jew to the Jews, in order that I may gain the Jews. To those under the law I became as under the law (although I myself am not under the law) in order that I may gain those under the law.

- Many have rightly pointed out that Paul's actions in Acts 21 reflect this attitude
- The key difference between Judaizing and true liberty lies in motives

Paul's Freedom and Calling <u>1 Corinthians 9:21 (LEB)</u> To those outside the law I became as outside the law (although I am not outside the law of God, but subject to the law of Christ) in order that I may gain those outside the law. • The word anomos (typically "lawless") appears 4 times in this verse • These uses have different nuances which must be carefully identified in context

Paul's Repetition Shows Purpose <u>1 Corinthians 9:22 (LEB)</u>

To the weak I became weak, in order that I may gain the weak. I have become all things to all people, in order that by all means I may save some.

- The parallel construction shows the meaning of "gain" = "save"
- Weak is not a pejorative term in 1 Cor.
- The weak are typically despised by man

I do all this for the sake of the gospel, in order that I may become a participant with it.

- The key word in this verse is "participant" which translates *sugkoino_nos* (4x NT)
- Paul is a sharer in gospel fellowship with all Christians in Corinth including the weak
- His approach to ministry involved serving and fellowship with all who are in Christ

Implications and Applications The world despises the weak, the very people God chooses and uses Fellowship in the gospel is a great honor and more valuable than anything the world offers

God's Actions Show His Purposes

1 Corinthians 1:26b-28 (NASB)

there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, and the base things of the world and the despised God has chosen, the things that are not, so that He may nullify the things that are,

2 Corinthians 12:9 (ESV) But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me.
