

Their Wives Likewise

1 Timothy 3:11

- I. We must be careful to delineate between the practice of serving and the office of the deacon.
 - A. The church at large has responsibilities toward the rest.
 - 1. All of God's people, whether male or female, must serve the church at large (Heb. 6:10).
 - 2. All of God's people, whether male or female, must oversee the church at large (Heb. 12:15).
 - B. In submission to Scripture, the church chooses certain men to have certain responsibilities to the rest of the church.
- II. Wives of deacons is a strong position, and the third line of argumentation on the matter of church leadership.
 - A. Some argue for female deacons.
 - 1. There wouldn't be qualifications for the wives of deacons and not for the wives of pastors.
 - 2. The term likewise seems to simply another office.
 - 3. There isn't a feminine form for the word deacon at this time.
 - 4. Paul didn't use a personal possessive pronoun with the term, which would have indicated a relationship.
 - B. Some believe 1 Tim. 3:11 describes deacon's wives (and therefore, not female deacons).
 - 1. The office of the deacon assists the office of the overseer (i.e., the office of the deacon is always with and after the office of the overseer).
 - 2. Paul used the generic term women in 3:11 which doesn't fit as a third category (e.g. overseers, deacons, and women).
 - 3. The placement of 3:11 in the midst of the qualification for deacons in 3:8-10 and 3:12-13.
 - 4. The omission of any marital or family requirements (if it were a reference to female deacons).
