Theme of the Book of Judges

The Judges are types of saviours: some prophets, some priests, some like kings or generals, all representing the true and only Begotten Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. God proves His faithfulness to His people both in corporate estates of humiliation and exaltation, which was surely a great comfort to the God-man, even as it is for us in Him. God's justice is exhibited in the 6 oppressions by God's enemies; yet also His mercy is exhibited in delivering His people from oppression according to His covenant promises. The idolatrous heart of humanity is taught in the two examples of idolatry at the end of the book, where they do whatever is right in their own eyes.
