To behold His majestic glory is breathtaking. But to <i>possess</i> His infinite grace is cause for rejoicing!

Jesus did not come to manifest God only, but to grant the very possession of His divine nature!

# God is not only revealing Himself to us, He is literally giving Himself to us.

# **Law and Grace Contrasted**
