The Westminster Confession of Faith

LORD'S SUPPER CELEBRATION

As we come to the Table of our Lord, let us remember that He gives us this to strengthen our faith.

Bread and wine were the main food sources of the lands in the Middle East. Without them one would face death. Food and drink are just as important for us to be able to live and work. In the same way, we must also see that the body and blood of Christ are just as important when it comes to our spiritual health and well-being. No believer can live without them. Without the sacrifice and death of Christ there is no forgiveness for us and no everlasting life. When the Holy Spirit works the body and blood of Christ into our lives they are truly a means through which our faith grows and deepens.

This Supper is meant for true believers; who are truly sorry for their sins and want to be rid of them. Through this meal Christ reminds us that He is with us and helps us in all our struggles and troubles with sin. This meal is meant to raise our confidence in Jesus Christ and His salvation.

This Supper also reminds us that we are united to Christ and to each other. It is a meal of union and communion. We eat of the same bread and drink of the same cup; in this way we "see" that in and through Christ we have become one. His sacrifice brings us together as nothing else can.

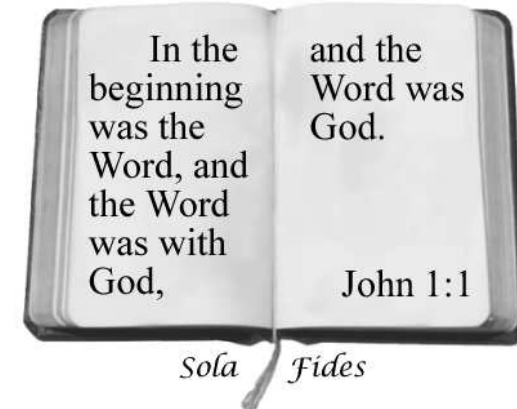
