## A. Review:

1. The key truth about God from the story of Joseph involves learning about His amazing sovereign and		
gracious	in preserving His	{the nation of Israel} in keeping with His
	{Genesis 50:20}	

2. The *key principle* for *You* to learn involves recognizing that regardless of your ADVERSE CIRCUMSTANCES, by God's grace you can \_\_\_\_\_\_ in God's unfailing PROVIDENTIAL CARE so as to be \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Him wherever you are.

B. Three New Testament Principles before we examine an Old Testament Example {James 5:1-12)

C. Valuable Principles to Learn from Prison Time. {Genesis 39:21-40:23}

- 1. If you seek to honor the Lord by standing firm on a \_\_\_\_\_\_, it may result in consequences initially instead of a temporal favorable outcome. (39:20; Ps. 105:18-19; 2 Tim. 3:12; 1 Peter 4:12-17) What is God doing through this? How was Joseph tested?
- 2. If you experience unjust suffering, you can trust that the \_\_\_\_\_ will be with you, as also will His \_\_\_\_\_ to go through the trial. (39:21a; Lam. 3:22-26) Do you understand the difference between deserve & undeserved suffering? With every trial, what can you expect from the Lord and what is He offering you?
