- 2 Peter 3:3 Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts,

## JULIAN HUXLEY THE FATHER OF UNESCO NWO ARM

- 1. Two of Huxley's grandsons achieved notoriety in their own right in the promotion of skepticism.
- 2. JULIAN HUXLEY, an atheist and a rabid Darwinist, had a tremendous influence through his writings, his work with the British and American Humanist Associations, and as the founder of UNESCO. He wrote,
- 3. "There is no separate supernatural realm: all phenomena are part of one natural process of evolution" (Essays of a Humanist, 1969).

- 4. At the Centennial Celebration of Darwin's Origin of Species at the University of Chicago in 1959, Julian gave the keynote speech entitled "The Evolutionary Vision." He said:
- 5. "Man's destiny is to be the sole agent for the future evolution of this planet. ... In the evolutionary pattern of thought there is no longer either need or room for the supernatural. The earth was not created, it evolved. So did all the animals and plants that inhabit it, including our human selves, mind and soul as well as brain and body. So did religion. Evolutionary man can no longer take refuge from his loneliness in the arms of a divinized father figure whom he has himself created, nor escape from the responsibility of making decisions by sheltering under the umbrella of Divine Authority ... the evolutionary vision is enabling us to discern, however incompletely, the lineaments of the new religion that we can be sure will arise to serve the needs of the coming era" (S. Tax and C. Callender, Evolution after Darwin, Vol. 3, pp. 252-253, 260).
- 6. Julian was the first president of the British Humanist Association, which was devoted to "living good lives without religious beliefs." In 2008, this association supported the Atheist Bus Campaign that sponsored banners proclaiming "There's probably no God; now stop worrying and enjoy your life."
- 7. Huxley was a co-founder of the American Humanist Association and was a signer of the 1933 Humanist Manifesto. Among its 15 statements were the following:
- 8. Religious humanists regard the universe as self-existing and not created.
- 9. Humanism asserts that the nature of the universe depicted by modern science makes unacceptable any supernatural or cosmic guarantees of human values.
  - We are convinced that the time has passed for theism, deism, modernism, and the several varieties of "new thought."
- 10. The distinction between the sacred and the secular can no longer be maintained.
- 11. It follows that there will be no uniquely religious emotions and attitudes of the kind hitherto associated with belief in the supernatural.
- 12. The Humanist Manifesto even called for the control and reconstitution of all religious institutions. Statement # 13 said:
- 13. "Religious humanism maintains that all associations and institutions exist for the fulfillment of human life. The intelligent evaluation, transformation, control, and direction of such associations and institutions with a view to the enhancement of human life is the purpose and program of humanism. Certainly religious institutions, their ritualistic forms, ecclesiastical methods, and communal activities must be reconstituted as rapidly as experience allows, in order to function effectively in the modern world."
- 14. In promotional literature for the American Humanist Association, Julian Huxley wrote:

- 15. "I use the word 'humanist' to mean someone who believes that man is just as much a natural phenomenon as an animal or plant; that his body, mind, and soul were not supernaturally created but are products of evolution, and that he is not under the control or guidance of any supernatural being or beings, but has to rely on himself and his own powers" (cited from Henry Morris, History of Modern Creationism, p. 81).
- 16. Romans 1:28 And even as they did not like to retain God in [their] knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient;
- 17. Romans 1:21 Because that, when they knew God, they glorified [him] not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.
- 18. Romans 1:22 Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools,
- 19. Romans 1:25 Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.
- 20. Huxley looked upon humanism as a religion and wrote a book entitled "Religion without Revelation."
- 21. Huxley used his position as first Director-General of UNESCO (the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization) to call for a one-world religion and a one-world government. In "A New World Vision," which Huxley wrote in 1946 as his vision for UNESCO, he said:
- 22. "Thus the general philosophy of UNESCO should, it seems, be a scientific world humanism, global in extent and evolutionary in background."
- 23. "The unifying of traditions into a single common pool of experience, awareness and purpose is the necessary prerequisite for further major progress in human evolution. Accordingly, although political unification in some sort of world government will be required for the definitive attainment of this state, unification in the things of the mind is not only necessary also, but it can pave the way for other types of unification."
- 24. Julian was also a racist and a eugenicist. He was convinced that society must "prevent the deterioration of quality of racial stock" (Huxley, Essays in Popular Science, 1926).
- 25.In 1947, Huxley said that the less desirable among mankind should not have easy access to relief or treatment:
- 26. "The lowest strata are reproducing too fast. Therefore ... they must not have too easy access to relief or hospital treatment lest the removal of the last check on natural selection should make it too easy for children to be produced or to survive; long unemployment should be a ground for sterilisation" (Huxley, Man in the Modern World, 1947).
- 27. Understand these wicked devils have a desire to rule the world, they are looking for that superman that man will evolve and attain higher knowledge and that perfect man will come- The antichrist
- 28. According to Huxley, the guiding philosophy of UNESCO should be what he termed, World Evolutionary Humanism. The following article describes this philosophy and its relation to eugenics.

- 29. Here it is only necessary to recall that in the last few decades it has been possible to develop an extended or general theory of evolution which can provide the necessary intellectual scaffolding for modern humanism.
- 30. Thus even though it is quite true that any radical eugenic policy will be for many years politically and psychologically impossible, it will be important for Unesco to see that the eugenic problem is examined with the greatest care, and that the public mind is informed of the issues at stake so that much that now is unthinkable may at least become thinkable."
- 31. "It is, however, essential that eugenics should be brought entirely within the borders of science, for, as already indicated, in the not very remote future the problem of improving the average quality of human beings is likely to become urgent; and this can only be accomplished by applying the findings of a truly scientific eugenics.
- **32.** Dr. Julian Huxley got involved in the production of Fantasia. Aldous and Julian Huxley are well known by conspiracy researchers for their roles in the World Order.
- **33.** To lay the foundations for world political unity
- **34.** Huxley argued that a common fundamental education is necessary for global unity to occur, and advocated for improved education among underprivileged populations whose educational systems were lacking:
- **35.** Basically, Julian Huxley saw scientific advancement, such as penicillin, DDT and water purification, as a two-edged sword. He wrote, "We can and should devote ourselves with truly religious devotion to the cause of ensuring greater fulfillment for the human race in its future destiny. And this involves a furious and concerted attack on the problem of population; for the control of population is... a prerequisite for any radical improvement in the human lot."[8]
- **36.** Julian also worked for British army intelligence
- **37.**HE INVENTED THE WORD TRANSHUMANISM
- **38.** The biologist Julian Huxley is generally regarded as the founder of transhumanism, after he used the term for the title of an influential 1957 article. (The term itself, however, derives from an earlier 1940 paper by the Canadian philosopher W. D. Lighthall.)[15] Huxley describes transhumanism in these terms:
- **39.** Up till now human life has generally been, as Hobbes described it, 'nasty, brutish and short'; the great majority of human beings (if they have not already died young) have been afflicted with misery... we can justifiably hold the belief that these lands of possibility exist, and that the present limitations and miserable frustrations of our existence could be in large measure surmounted... The human species can, if it wishes, transcend itself not just sporadically, an individual here in one way, an individual there in another way, but in its entirety, as humanity.[16]
- **40.** Evolution all things are possible to these heathens

- 1. ALDOUS HUXLEY (1894-1963), another one of Thomas's grandsons, was a mystic who believed that he was enlightened through drug use.
- 2. As a young man he "discarded dogmatic religion altogether" (Anne Bancroft, *Twentieth-Century Mystics and Sages*, p. 8). He leapt from one mystical path to another "like a grasshopper." He studied hypnosis, psychic phenomena, meditation, automatic writing, and other things, but he was particularly drawn to Hinduism and Buddhism.
- 3. The Perennial Philosophy. In this he discussed the teachings of various mystics and described his religious views at that time. He said they were based "on direct experience," which is the mystical approach. But it was in 1952 when Huxley claimed to have finally achieved enlightenment. This was through the ingestion of mescaline. He said that this experience cleansed the "doors of
- 4. perception." He continued to use drugs, including LSD, to the end of his life. On his deathbed his wife gave him LSD and sat beside him reading the occultic Tibetan Book of the Dead.
- 5. In his books The Doors of Perception and Heaven and Hell, Huxley described his drug experiences in terms of spiritual enlightenment. He thought that the brain acted as a filter or a "reducing valve" that did not allow man to readily connect with the pantheistic "mind at large." Through drugs, yoga, and ascetic practices the brain's filtering function was weakened, allowing the individual to tap into the "truth."
- 6. Huxley has had a great influence on rock & roll and on the modern world at large. The 60s rock group The Doors were named after his doctrine. They, too, used drugs as a door to "another world," to "break on through to the other side."
- 7. Huxley was associated with the Esalen Institute and had an influence on the Human Potential field that exploded in the 70s and 80s.
- 8. In 1937, Huxley moved to California to find work in Hollywood writing screenplays, but in the following decades he would turn to deeper spiritual pursuits in eastern mysticism and psychedelic explorations (Pradas). These pilgrimages were recorded and expounded upon in a series of revolutionary works including Heaven and Hell (1956), and Island (1962). By the 1960s, Huxley was a cult figure in the drug culture he helped spawn and even inspired some of the most famous rock groups; the Beatles used his image on the Sgt. Pepper's album cover and The Doors rock band borrowed their name from his psychedelic manifesto, The Doors of Perception (1954) which Huxley actually

- borrowed from a poem of William Blake's. At age 72, Aldous Leonard Huxley died of cancer on November 22, 1963, the very day John F. Kennedy was assassinated.
- 9. In Berlin in fall 1930, the Beast entertained his old friend John Sullivan and Sullivan's friend, the writer Aldous Huxley. Crowley is usually credited with introducing Huxley to the wonders of mescaline, but he also aided Huxley's plan to interview prominent men of science. On 3 October, the Mage's diary records "wire Einstein for Huxley."66
- 10. Why was Huxley entertaining prominent men of Science and Why did Einstein meet with Huxley and why did Crowley know Einstein

- 12. Crowley divorced Rose in 1910 after she succumbed to alcoholic dementia and was placed in an asylum. Crowley's second wife also went insane, and five of his numerous mistresses committed suicide.
- 13. The first known instance of Aldous Huxley taking mescaline was on May 5th 1953 (aged 59). The psychiatrst Dr. Humphrey Osmond provided the drug, at the time still legal, and recorded the event in detail. Dr. Osmond introduced Huxley to millionaire Alfred Matthew Hubbard who manufactured LSD on an industrial scale. And so on Christmas Eve 1955 Huxley took his first dose of what would soon be known as 'acid'.
- 14. Trained at Toynbee's Oxford, Aldous Huxley was one of the initiates in the "Children of the Sun," a Dionysian cult comprised of the children of Britain's Roundtable elite.4 Among the other initiates were T.S. Eliot, W.H. Auden, Sir Oswald Mosley, and D.H. Lawrence, Huxley's homosexual lover. It was Huxley, furthermore, who would launch the legal battle in the 1950s to have Lawrence's pornographic novel Lady Chatterley's Lover allowed into the United States on the ground that it was a misunderstood "work of art."5
- 15. A major aspect of this cult, the so-called Dionysian aspect, involved the use of hallucinogenic drugs, alcohol and music with a hypnotic beat like much of today's pop "music." This was originally intended to stimulate the unthinking clairvoyant mode of consciousness, which allowed mankind to commune with the spirit world ("visitation of the gods"). This mode of consciousness was fading at that point, and mankind was gradually becoming aware of the physical world. We did not yet have the ability to reason, which is why so much effort was devoted to obtaining the advice of the gods. Prof Julian Jaynes' book The Origin of Consciousness in the Breakdown of the Bicameral Mind presents evidence of this transition and tries to explain it from a Darwinian perspective, since Darwinism is the official religion of the scientific establishment.
- 16. Aldous Huxley, along with his brother Julian, was tutored at Oxford by H.G. Wells, the head of British foreign intelligence during World War I and the spiritual grandfather of the Aquarian Conspiracy.

- 17. Huxley, according to The Aquarian Conspiracy by EIR, was the "high priest" of the Dionysian "opium war" on America. Arnold Toynbee, a historian and an intellectual guru of British Intelligence who had trained Huxley at Oxford, proclaimed that the British Empire could prevent its demise if it were to "devote itself to the recruitment and training of an ever-expanding priesthood dedicated to the principles of imperial rule."
- 18. D.H. Lawrence, Huxley's homosexual lover, also belonged to Children of the Sun, and one of his letters to Bertrand Russell seems to imply that they were both in a Satanic cult (see my page on Russell). Huxley was also a protégé of Satanist H.G. Wells, whose book The Open Conspiracy [10] provided the organizing principles for the Aquarian Conspiracy.
- 19. Under Wells's tutelage, Huxley was first introduced to Aleister Crowley. Crowley was a product of the cultist circle that developed in Britain from the 1860s under the guiding influence of Edward Bulwer-Lytton [a cabalist who held "magic parties" at his estate, and who wrote novels based on the occult and the ancient Isis cult] -- who, it will be recalled, was the colonial minister under Lord Palmerston [a Satanist] during the Second Opium War. In 1886, Crowley, William Butler Yeats, and several other Bulwer-Lytton protégées formed the Isis-Urania Temple of Hermetic Students of the Golden Dawn. This Isis Cult was organized around the 1877 manuscript Isis Unveiled by Madame Helena Blavatsky, in which the Russian occultist called for the British aristocracy to organize itself into an Isis priesthood.
- 20. The connection between Satanic cults and drug running shows up frequently in the course of studying Satanism. This reflects the Dionysian aspect of Satanic cults, as well as their sub-criminal nature.
- 21. Huxley headed for the U.S. in 1937 and remained for the duration of WWII. While here, he wrote scripts for major movie studios and organized a network of Isis cults in San Francisco and southern California, which included hundreds of people who venerated various pagan gods. Dope, Inc. sums it up as follows:
- 22. In effect, Huxley and [pederast] Isherwood ... laid the foundations during the late 1930s and the 1940s for the later LSD culture, by recruiting a core of "initiates" into the Isis cults that Huxley's mentors, Bulwer-Lytton, Blavatsky, and Crowley, had constituted while stationed in India. [12]
- 23. A tremendous amount of effort went into popularizing LSD and other hallucinogenic drugs. Even the CIA got in the act, using various rationales including "mind control," which I suspect is an allusion to possession or simply mind-destruction:
- 24. Huxley established contact during this Harvard period with the president of Sandoz, which at the time was working on a CIA contract to produce large quantities of LSD and psilocybin (another synthetic hallucinogenic drug) for MK-Ultra, the CIA's official chemical warfare experiment.

  According to recently released CIA documents, Allen Dulles purchased over 100 million doses of LSD -- almost all of which flooded the streets of

- the United States during the late 1960s. During the same period, Leary began privately purchasing large quantities of LSD from Sandoz as well.
- 25. Huxley founded a nest of Isis cults in southern California and in San Francisco, that consisted exclusively of several hundred deranged worshipers of Isis and other cult gods. Isherwood, during the California period, translated and propagated a number of ancient Zen Buddhist documents, inspiring Zen-mystical cults along the way.8
- 26. During the fall of 1960, Huxley was appointed visiting professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Boston. Around his stay in that city, Huxley created a circle at Harvard parallel to his West Coast LSD team. The Harvard group included Huxley, Osmund, and Watts (brought in from California), Timothy Leary, and Richard Alpert.
- 27. So here is the point these wicked people taught their children to hate God and to worship lucifer and that is exactly what they did

- 30. Huxley became terminally ill with cancer in 1963. On November 22nd he was literally on his death-bed at home. Unable to speak, he wrote a note to his wife Laura which simply said: 'LSD 100 micrograms intramuscular.' Huxley knew death was imminent. So confident was he in his ability to deal with the effects of a powerful hallucinogen that he was taking the ultimate step in altered consciousness; to cross over from life to death during an acid trip.
- 31. Injected into his arm by Laura the drug must have entered his brain like a freight train. In spite of this sudden change in consciousness Huxley remained totally calm, lying in bed with his eyes closed, breathing slowly. Some time later Laura asked if he would like a second dose. He nodded in assent and a further 100 micrograms was administered. Time passed and Huxley's breathing became calmer and softer and he died with Laura at his side, on his face a serene smile.
