... despising prophecies

1) Neglect - v. 20

1 Thessalonians 5:19-22

"don't treat them as nothing"

2 Peter 1:19 – We have the prophetic word made more sure, to which you do well to pay attention, as to a lamp shining in a dark place.

Hebrews 2:1-4...

2) Accepting without Examining – v. 21

1 John 4:1 says, Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world.

Acts 17:11 – examining the Scriptures daily to see whether these things were so...
