Let's Study Philippians (25)

THE HUNGER OF THE LIVING SOUL I. To know Christ II. To live Christ

I. The hunger of the living soul is to know Christ

- A. Paul's petition seems mysterious, yet it is the experience of 'real lovers'
 - 1. Biblical meaning of to 'know' (Gen. 4:1; Amos 3:2)
 - 2. This hunger is the sign of healthy spiritual life
- B. What did Paul mean with this desire to *know Him*?
 - 1. Not merely intellectual facts about the glorious Person of Jesus Christ
 - 2. But more an experiential tasting or experiencing of His amazing love and grace

II. The hunger of the living soul is to live Christ

- A. Real love is NOT content to experience love but to live love
 - 1. Define real love:
 - 2. Paul wanted to be like Christ in His living love to God and neighbors
- B. The pathway to be like Christ is two-fold
 - 1st to know the power of His resurrection
 - a. to 'know' includes to know the facts and fruits of Jesus' resurrection
 - b. yet here it means mostly to experience the power of Jesus' resurrection

- 2nd to have fellowship Christ's sufferings (vs. 10b, 11) a. this is God's way to *become like Christ* (Acts 14:22; Rom. 8:28-29)
 - b. God is free to use *any means* to bring us there (vs. 11)

Closing Applications

- A. How few Christians are Christians like Paul!
 - 1. Many are keen to wear Jesus's crown but not to share His cross (Phil. 3:18-19)
 - 2. Reflect upon yourself then in light of Christ's life as seen in Paul's life
- B. Though not easy, no life is more beautiful and satisfying than a holy life
 - 1. Holiness is its own reward (Thomas Brooks)
 - a. Gal. 6:7-8 "... if we sow to the Spirit, we shall of the Spirit reap everlasting life"
 - b. 1 Tim. 6:1 ... but godliness with contentment is great gain!
