### Journey Through Acts "I Believe God!" Acts 27:1-44

#### Introduction:

- 1. Please Turn With Me In Your Bibles Tonight:
  - To Acts 27 As We Are Getting Close:
    - To The End Of Our:
      - Journey Through Acts!
        - Acts 27!
  - Where The Apostle Paul:
    - Is Once Again On The Move!
      - After More Than Two Years:
        - In A Holding Pattern In The City Of Caesarea:
          - As A Prisoner Of The Roman Empire!
  - Finally He Is Able To Set His Sights:
    - On The City Of Rome Itself!
      - All Because Of God's Promise To Him:
        - Back In 23:11 Which May Seem Like Forever Ago By Now!
          - To Us And Certainly To Paul!
    - But The Lord Came To Him By Night:
      - And Said To Him;
        - "Be of good cheer, Paul: for as thou hast testified of me in Jerusalem, so must thou bear witness also at Rome!"
- 2. Well It Is Pretty Clear:
  - That There Were Some Christian Brothers:
    - Who Accompanied Paul On His Journey!
      - And Luke The Writer Of This:
        - The Very First Book On Church History:
          - Was One Of Them!
  - So Luke Describes For Us:
    - In Vivid Detail:
      - How They Began Their Journey:
        - By Ship To Rome!
  - 27:1-8 "And when it was determined that we should sail into Italy, they delivered Paul and certain other prisoners unto one named Julius, a centurion of Augustus' band. / 2 And entering into a ship of Adramyttium, we launched, meaning to sail by the coasts of Asia; one Aristarchus, a Macedonian of Thessalonica, being with us. / 3 And the next day we touched at Sidon. And Julius courteously entreated Paul, and gave him liberty to go unto his friends to refresh himself. / 4 And when we had launched from thence, we sailed under Cyprus, because the winds were contrary. / 5 And when we had sailed over the sea of Cilicia and Pamphylia, we came to Myra, a city of Lycia. / 6 And there the centurion found a ship of Alexandria sailing into Italy; and he put us therein. / 7 And when we had sailed slowly many days, and scarce were come over against Cnidus, the wind not suffering us, we sailed under Crete, over against Salmone; / 8 And, hardly passing it, came unto a place which is called The fair havens; nigh whereunto was the city of Lasea!"
    - Here Is A Map:
      - That Provides Some Detail Of:
        - Paul's Journey Starting In Caesarea:
          - And Then Providing Some Of The Ports Of Call Along The Way!
  - Their First Stop:
    - Was According To 27:3 The City Of Sidon!
      - "The distance between Caesarea and Sidon is 67 land miles, and to travel that distance in a single day [would have required] a leading wind. The prevailing wind at that time of year was from the west. This would have allowed them to cover the distance in the time stated!" (Jefferson White)
        - But After Being In Bonds For Over Two Years With Chains On His Wrists For Much Of That Time:
          - Paul Has The Opportunity To Be "Refreshed" When "Julius Courteously Entreated Paul, And Gave Him Liberty To Go Unto His Friends!"
    - That Is His Christian Friends!

- Imagine The Fellowship & The Joy:
  - Paul Would Have Experienced With Those Brothers & Sisters In Christ!
    - He Did Not Have The Opportunity To Worship The Lord At Church:
      - For Over Two Years!
- What A Blessing This Was For Paul!
  - And What A Gift This Was:
    - From The Lord!
- And I Think We Can See From This That:

### 1. In Times Of Desolation – There Can Still Be A Refreshment:

- From The Lord:
  - And Through His People!
- Unfortunately Fellowship With God's People:
  - Is Something That Is All-Too-Easy:
    - For Us To Take For Granted!
      - Until Those Opportunities Are Taken Away From Us!
  - **IE:** Can't Tell You How Many Times I've Spoken With Members Who Were Shut-Ins Whether At Home Or In A Nursing Home Who Just Longed To Be Able To Attend Church One Last Time! They Missed The Place! They Missed The People! They Missed The Praise! And They Missed The Proclamation Of God's Precious Word!
- Don't Take For Granted:
  - The Opportunities You Now Have:
    - To Enjoy The Fellowship Of God's People:
      - As You Worship The Lord Together!
  - What A Great Time They Must Have Had Together:
    - In The City Of Sidon!
      - But Alas It Was Time To Move On!
        - And So Luke Records:
- Their Second Stop:
  - Which Was According To 27:7 The City Of Myra:
    - Which Was Already Past The Home Country:
      - Of Paul!
  - The City Of Myra:
    - Was At That Time A Major Port City:
      - And Was Where Paul And The Other Prisoners Were Transferred To Another Ship:
        - That Was Taking A More Direct Route To Rome!
  - And It Was On This Ship:
    - Where The Well-Known Adventure:
      - Of Paul And 275 Other Passengers:
        - Begins!

#### - This Is What One Of Those:

- Ancient Cargo Ships:
  - Might Have Looked Like!
- It Would Have Been Large Enough To Accommodate:
  - All The Sailors, Passengers, Tackle:
    - As Well As The Cargo!
- And According To 27:8 Since The Winds:
  - Were Not As Swift As They Expected:
    - They Made The Island Of Crete:
- Their Third Stop:

# - And A Harbor On The South Side Of Crete:

- Known As "The Fair Havens!"
  - And With A Name Like That:
    - It Had To Have Been As Beautiful A Port Then:
      - As It Is Now!
- But This Is Where The "Easy" Part:
  - Of Paul's Journey Ends!
    - Because As Luke Tells Us In:

- 27:9-17 "Now when much time was spent, and when sailing was now dangerous, because the fast [Likely, The Day Of Atonement, Which Usually Falls Somewhere In Betwen Mid-September & Mid-October] was now already past, Paul admonished them, / 10 And said unto them, Sirs, I perceive that this voyage will be with hurt and much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of our lives. / 11 Nevertheless the centurion believed the master and the owner of the ship, more than those things which were spoken by Paul. / 12 And because the haven was not commodious to winter in, the more part advised to depart thence also, if by any means they might attain to Phenice, and there to winter; which is an haven of Crete, and lieth toward the south west and north west. / 13 And when the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained their purpose, loosing thence, they sailed close by Crete. / 14 But not long after there arose against it a tempestuous wind, called Euroclydon. / 15 And when the ship was caught, and could not bear up into the wind, we let her drive. / 16 And running under a certain island which is called Clauda, we had much work to come by the boat: / 17 Which when they had taken up, they used helps, undergirding the ship; and, fearing lest they should fall into the quicksands, strake sail, and so were driven!"
  - The Veteran Captain & Sailors Of The Ship:
    - Thought It Best To Try For Another Harbor:
      - On The South Of Crete!
        - For One Reason The City Of Phoenix / Phenice Was A Major City In That Day And The Sailors Would Have Plenty Of Entertainment There Through The Winter!
  - But As They Attempted To Round:
    - The Cape Of Matala To Go The 34 Miles:
      - To The Harbor Unexpectedly:
        - 27:14 "A Tempestuous Wind" Arose "Called Euroclydon!"
    - "Meteorological evidence reveals that a sudden change from a mild southerly wind to a violent northeasterly wind often occurs in late fall in the eastern Mediterranean!" (Jefferson White)
      - And The Term "Euroclydon" Which Is A Combination Of Latin & Greek Words Can Be Translated A "North-Easter" Or A "Nor-Easter!" Familiar To Those Who Live In New York & New England!
  - But Just Before All Of This:
    - 27:10 The Apostle Paul "Said unto them, Sirs, I perceive that this voyage will be with hurt and much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of our lives!"
      - And We Can Glean From This That:
- 2. In Times Of Difficulty There Can Still Be A Reminder:
  - About What All Of God's People:
    - Will Face In This World!
      - Certainly The Apostle Paul:
        - Was Given The Gift Of Prophecy:
          - And Was Speaking Words Given To Him:
            - By The Holy Spirit!
  - But For Us There Really Is No Need Of Prophecy:
    - To Know & Recognize:
      - That We Will Face:
        - Trouble & Trials:
          - And Even Temptations:
            - In This Life!
  - In Fact This Kind Of Life:
    - Has Already Been Prophesied To Us!
      - In 2 Timothy 3:1 Paul Tells Us That:
        - "In the last days perilous times shall come!"
      - And In 2 Timothy 3:12 Paul Tells Us That:
        - "Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution!"
  - So When Trials & Difficulties Do Come:
    - We Must Remember That:
      - They Do Not Take The Lord By Surprise!
        - But We Can Be Confident That The Lord Himself Is Still In Control!
          - And Is Still Directing Our Paths!
    - But As Paul's Journey Becomes More Difficult:
      - And The Weather Becomes More Dark:

- Luke Continues In:
- 27:18-26 "And we being exceedingly tossed with a tempest, the next day they lightened the ship; / 19 And the third day we cast out with our own hands the tackling of the ship. / 20 And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on us, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away. / 21 But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and [Says The Biggest "I Told You So" In The History Of "I Told You So's! He] said, Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete, and to have gained this harm and loss. / 22 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer: for there shall be no loss of any man's life among you, but of the ship. / 23 For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, / 24 Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee. / 25 Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me. / 26 Howbeit we must be cast upon a certain island!"
  - When Everything Was Dark & Bleak:
    - And Nigh-Well Hopeless:
      - Who Comes On The Scene Once Again?
        - The Lord! 27:23 The "Angel Of The Lord" Who Brings Tidings Of "Good Cheer" To Paul And All Who Are With Him!
  - Somewhere In The Middle Of The Mediterranean Sea:
    - God Once Again Encourages His Servant:
      - By His Presence:
        - And With His Promise!
    - 27:24 "Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee!"
      - And We Can See From This That:

# 3. In Times Of Darkness – There Can Still Be A Refuge!

- As We Sang Earlier Today:
  - From Psalm 142:5:
    - "I cried unto thee, O LORD: I said, Thou art my refuge and my portion in the land of the living!"
- No Matter How Dark:
  - This Old World Seems To Get:
    - God Himself:
      - Can Be & Will Be:
        - Your Perpetual Refuge!
  - If You Can Say With Paul In 27:23:
    - "God Whose I Am & Whom I Serve!"
  - The Ship May Have Been Caught:
    - In The Clutches Of The Storm!
      - But The Storm Itself:
        - Was In The Hands Of The Lord!
- And This Is Still True:
  - For The Dark Storms:
    - That Will Swirl Around You Today!
      - Remember That "When Shadows Fall & The Night Covers All & There Are Things That Your Eyes Cannot See!" You Can Still Sing "I'll Never Fear, For The Savior Is Near! My Lord Abides With Me!"
- And How Did Paul Respond:
  - To The Lord's Presence:
    - And The Lord's Renewed Promise:
      - To Him?
  - 27:25 "Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me!"
    - Paul Believed God!
      - And So Can You!
        - God Is Trustworthy!
  - You & I Like Paul:
    - Can Be "Fully Persuaded That, What [God Has] Promised, He [Is] Able Also To Perform!" (Romans 4:21)
  - And Even Though:
    - The Storm Did Not Yet Subside:

- Paul's Faith In The Lord:
  - Helped Carry Him Through The Rest Of The Ordeal!
    - Which Luke Continues To Describe In:
- 27:27-37 "But when the fourteenth night was come, as we were driven up and down in Adria, about midnight the shipmen deemed that they drew near to some country; / 28 And sounded, and found it twenty fathoms: and when they had gone a little further, they sounded again, and found it fifteen fathoms. / 29 Then fearing lest we should have fallen upon rocks, they cast four anchors out of the stern, and wished for the day. / 30 And as the shipmen were about to flee out of the ship, when they had let down the boat into the sea, under colour as though they would have cast anchors out of the foreship, / 31 Paul said to the centurion and to the soldiers, Except these abide in the ship, ye cannot be saved. / 32 Then the soldiers cut off the ropes of the boat, and let her fall off. / 33 And while the day was coming on, Paul besought them all to take meat, saying, This day is the fourteenth day that ye have tarried and continued fasting, having taken nothing. / 34 Wherefore I pray you to take some meat: for this is for your health: for there shall not an hair fall from the head of any of you. / 35 And when he had thus spoken, he took bread, and gave thanks to God in presence of them all: and when he had broken it, he began to eat. / 36 Then were they all of good cheer, and they also took some meat. / 37 And we were in all in the ship two hundred threescore and sixteen souls!"
  - The Faith Paul Had:
    - Was Contagious!
      - Even The Roman Centurion Caught A Little Bit Of It!
  - It Was Clear That There Was Something Different About Paul!
    - And There Was Something Different About Paul's God!
      - And So Julius Was Going To Trust Paul, As Paul Trusted God!
  - And Then We Read About Something Astounding!
    - A Thanksgiving Meal:
      - Right There In The Midst Of A Treacherous Storm!
        - And We Learn Once Again That:

## 4. In Times Of Despair – There Can Still Be A Rejoicing!

- The Sailors Were In Despair!
  - That Is Why They Tried To Make A Break:
    - For The Shore On Their Own!
      - But Armed With Faith:
        - In The Power & The Love Of God:
          - Paul Was In "Good Cheer" And Led The Others To Feel The Same Way!
- No Matter What You Face:
  - You Still Have Much To "Give Thanks To God" About!
    - Is This How You Live Before The World?
  - Is There Something Different About You?
    - And Can The World See Something Different About Your God:
      - Through You?
  - Instead Of Hoarding His Faith & His Food:
    - To Himself With Joy, He Offered Them Both:
      - To All Who Where In The Ship!
        - And We Should Do The Same!
- But All Those In The Ship:
  - Were Not In The Clear Yet!
    - They Still Had One Final Challenge To Go!
      - The Utter Destruction Of The Ship Off The Coasts Of Rocky Island Way Off Their Course Called Here "Melita" Or As We Know It Today Malta!
- 27:38-44 28:1 "And when they had eaten enough, they lightened the ship, and cast out the wheat into the sea. / 39 And when it was day, they knew not the land: but they discovered a certain creek with a shore, into the which they were minded, if it were possible, to thrust in the ship. / 40 And when they had taken up the anchors, they committed themselves unto the sea, and loosed the rudder bands, and hoised up the mainsail to the wind, and made toward shore. / 41 And falling into a place where two seas met, they ran the ship aground; and the forepart stuck fast, and remained unmoveable, but the hinder part was broken with the violence of the waves. / 42 And the soldiers' counsel was to kill the prisoners, lest any of them should swim out, and escape. / 43 But the centurion, willing to save Paul, kept them from their purpose; and commanded that they which could swim should cast

themselves first into the sea, and get to land: / 44 And the rest, some on boards, and some on broken pieces of the ship. And so it came to pass, that they escaped all safe to land. / 1 And when they were escaped, then they knew that the island was called Melita!"

- And So When They Were Safe On The Beach Of Melita:
  - We See That:
- 5. In Times Of Danger There Can Still Be A Rescue!
  - Paul Knew There Was Hope:
    - In That Ship Because:
      - The Lord Was In That Ship!
        - And This Is True:
          - No Matter What Danger You May Experience In Your Life & In This World!

#### **Conclusion:**

- 1. There Are Many Lessons We Can Learn:
  - With Paul In This Storm:
    - Because As Robert Hawker Once Wrote:
      - "There Is Nothing More Striking To Represent The Life Of God's People In Their Passage Through This World, Than That Of The Storms And Tempests Of The Deep!"
- 2. But What Can The Lord Do:
  - With Those Storms:
    - And With That Tempest?
      - Psalm 107:29-30 "He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still. / Then are they glad because they be quiet; so he bringeth them unto their desired haven!"
  - Robert Hawker Continues:
    - "Such Is The Voyage Of Life To The Saints Of God! Storms And Tempests Everywhere Abound! But Christ Is An Hiding Place From The Wind, And A Covert From The Tempest!"
- 3. And So In The Savior:
  - In Jesus Christ Alone:
    - You Can Find:
      - Refreshment:
        - In Times Of Desolation!
      - Remembrance:
        - In Times Of Difficulty!
      - Refuge:
        - In Times Of Darkness!
      - Rejoicing:
        - In Times Of Despair!
      - And Even Rescue:
        - In Times Of Danger!
- 4. Just Believe As Paul Did:
  - In The Person:
    - The Presence:
      - And The Promises:
        - Of The Lord!
  - As David Puts It:
    - In Psalm 37:5 "Commit Thy Way!"
      - As The Sailors Committed The Ship To The Ways Of The Sea!
        - "Commit Thy Way Unto The Lord! Trust Also In Him! And He Shall Bring It To Pass!"
