INTRODUCTION: THE FEAR OF ORPHANHOOD

In John chapters 14-17, Jesus is dealing with His disciples' fears and preparing them for life without Him. v. 1, v. 28

1-6 He taught them how they would relate to him and the purpose for his going.

7-14 dealt with their occupation while He was away and the help they could receive, simply by praying.

15-24 deal with the fear of abandonment.

The repetition of "in"

The repetition of who loves whom and how you know.

And the fact that in the middle of this section, Jesus assures them that He wouldn't leave them as orphans.

Losing one's birth family...regardless of the age it occurs, is traumatic. Scientists have now confirmed that trauma does indeed change a person's brain neurochemistry. These changes can cause a host of difficulties...being easily overwhelmed, hyper-vigilance, overwhelming anxiety, disassociation, volatility, depression, sense of hopelessness.
