Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. Please prepare your heart by reading through the bulletin, praying for those leading and worshipping around you, and silencing all communication devices.

We encourage parents to involve children as soon as possible in the worship service. In consideration of other worshippers, we request parents with children not yet ready for unobtrusive participation in worship to utilize the nursery or, if necessary, the cry room. A nursery is available for children ages 3 months to 3 years during all Sunday morning activities.

Prelude Call toWorship

This psalm provides a thematic basis for today's service. We will be returning to various verses within it during elements of the service. For now, notice the call in the last verse of the psalm.

This verse, in a psalm celebrating the atonement God provides apart from our works (cf. Romans 4:6-8), also includes the other side of the coin: the role of obedience and its relationship to the grace of forgiveness with respect to our covenant relationship to God.

Corporate Confession of Sin

Again, the hopeful emphasis in this confession is on what God has done to deliver the sinner and an appeal for mercy. But also present is the desire, borne of repentance, for God to guide and to teach by His truth the way to actual righteousness and obedience, which are essential to a healthy relationship with God.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

- I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
