Someone has written these remarks concerning this passage: "This was Paul's defiant, triumphant cry in the face of every trouble, of every contingency, of every conceivable trial or temptation, nof every emergency that might arise. He seems to challenge every force of the entire universe. He laughs at death. He defies principalities and powers. he hurls the gauntlet at things present and things to come. Though to be accounted as a sheep for the slaughter and be killed all the day long, yet victory shall be his. Neither tribulation, nor distress, nor persecution, nor famine, nor nakedness, nor peril, nor sword shall separate him from the love of Christ. There is nothing that shall ever separate Paul from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus the Lord. Not only will he conquer, but he will be more than conqueror." That which Paul stated for himself he also stated for us because he said "Who can separate"."
