



**“A Flame for the Gospel”**  
2 Timothy 1:6-14

*Ephesians 4:30; Acts 7:51; Matthew 12:31-32*

- I. Timothy is reminded to \_\_\_\_\_ a flame for the gifts God had given him (1:6).
- This is a simple reminder to \_\_\_\_\_ gospel ministry all over again and again.
  - Verse seven begins with a \_\_\_\_\_ marker, the word “for,” which tells us that fear from abundant persecution would have been a source of hindrance for Timothy and others in Ephesus (1:7).

- II. Paul invites Timothy to disregard the \_\_\_\_\_ of being persecuted and enter into a share of \_\_\_\_\_ for the gospel (1:8).
