Intro:

READ WLC Q&A 170

<u>Main Point of Text:</u> Christians have precious *fellowship* with God in Christ through the acts of the Lord's Supper.

Sermon Point: You Truly Fellowship with the Lord in His Supper.

Move 1: You truly do not literally eat Christ's body, nor do you literally drink His blood.

- LC: "... the body and blood of Christ are <u>not corporally or carnally present</u> in, with, or under the bread and wine in the Lord's supper": Acts 3:21: Christ's body in heaven. Figure of speech, like seven "I Am's". Mt. 26:26, 28: spiritual then: He passed only literal bread/wine as now.
- LC: "they that worthily communicate in the sacrament of the Lord's supper ... feed upon the body and blood of Christ, not after a corporal and carnal ... manner":

Move 2: You truly do feed on and drink of Christ and His benefits by faith in His Supper.

- LC: "... the body and blood of Christ ... yet are <u>spiritually present to the faith</u> of the receiver, no less <u>truly and really</u> than the elements themselves are to their outward senses": 1 Cor. 11:27, 29: unworthy partaking/discerning elements makes guilty/damned. Something really going on in you presence! Christ's spiritually present!
- LC: "they that worthily communicate in the sacrament of the Lord's supper, do therein feed upon the body and blood of Christ ... in a spiritual manner, yet truly and really, while by faith they receive and apply unto themselves Christ crucified, and all the benefits of his death.": 1 Cor. 10:16: "is it not the communion" w/ Christ's body/blood? Rhetorical question, it IS! Greek for communion is "fellowship".
